REMOS KILLIAN RIN 12422

Abstracted from *Northshore Citizen* serving Bothell and other areas of Washington State, dated 17 Nov 1999. The newspaper included a photo of **Remos** and his sister-in-law **Bonnie**. They are RINs 12422 & 35722, respectively.

Remos Killian considered skydiving for his 90th birthday, on 1 Nov 1999, but had second thoughts because he figured it was too expensive and his legs just aren't what they used to be. Aside from that he makes few concessions about his age. It's not his style.

"I still have control of my

spirit," he said. "You have to work at it. If the little things begin to bother us they'll take over."

He has shown a hard-driven yet compassionate spirit from his days of working in the mines of Idaho and helping young men climb up the corporate ladder of the insurance industry in the 1940s. Looking back over a career that brought him many accolades – the biggest from helping others find success – he is proud to say he's worked hard all his life.

I realized I'd gotten where I was by trying to help others try to be as good as they could be," he said.

Remos was born in 1909 in the Missouri Ozarks. In 1911, the family moved to Idaho where they eventually settled in the small town of Burke. His ancestry goes back to**Andreas** through **Samuel C. Killian**.

At 15 **Remos** dropped out of school and started working in the mines of Idaho. He eventually went back to school and completed three years of credits in two years, and earned a spot on the school's honor roll.

He worked his way through a few years at the University of Idaho and eventually moved to San Jose, CA but not before marrying his childhood sweetheart, **Nadine June LeFavor**. One of his first jobs in San Jose was running a Mobil gas station, which had seen three different owners in nine months. During the day **Remos** would hire local teens to watch the station while he traveled to local businesses armed with a bucket of water, a rag and a tire pressure gauge. After washing the windows and checking the tires, **Remos** would fill out a report card letting the potential customer know if any tires were low and directing him to his gas station to solve the problem.

Soon the world was at war and Remos moved to Napa, CA to become a welder for military projects. **Remos** was not the first with **Killian** ancestry to be in Napa. See the story of **George Calvert Yount** in Volume 2 Number 1 of the 1994 issue of *The Killian Family Newsletter*.

Many of his welding jobs required him to use mirrors while lying on his back and welding in precarious positions. Only three other men in the group could perform the feat.

His longest stint with a company came soon after the war when he took a job with State Farm Insurance. At the time the company primarily served rural areas. Remos changed that, taking State Farm into the bigger cities of San Francisco and Bakersfield. Along the way, he established a number of friendships with employees and their families. To those families, many of which are in the third generation, he is known as Uncle **Remos**. While at State Farm "Uncle Remos" helped many a young agent work his way up the corporate ladder using a

philosophy he had long since adapted into his personal life. "Life is made less complicated by taking a few nuggets of wisdom and sticking with them", he said. Among his most cherished are: "Know the way, pay the price." and "You don't have to like it, you have to understand it."

When **Nadine**, his wife of sixty years died, he found that living alone in Albuquerque, NM was lonely. **Bonnie Jean Lane** [RIN 12423], the widow of **Remos**' brother, **Stanley Killian** [RIN 35723], felt the same loneliness. They vacationed together in 1998 and decided to combine forces. He moved to**Bonnie's** home area in Bothel, WA.

As far as living as long as he has, **Remos** says it all comes down to staying active and taking care of your body. "Too many people don't give their body as much attention as they give their car," he said.

Remos wrote to **Bill Killian** of NC in Nov 1999. His was a moderately large and very clear hand. One might wonder how his writing could have been much better, but he said: "Like many other 'skills' where 'age' takes its toll, my penmanship is beginning to show it too." He mentioned attending a family reunion in Fredericktown, MO about 1993.

AUDIE MURPHY STAMP

For many years the American Legion has requested that the U S Postal Service honor some of the outstanding military heros of the US on stamps. The Postal Service has announced that this year stamps will be issued to honor John L. Hines, Omar N. Bradley, Alvin C. York and Audie Murphy.

As was reported in the second number of the 1999 Killian Family Newsletter **Audie Murphy**'s mother was a **Killian**. I believe we have identified her connection to the **Andreas Killian line**. The **Audie Murphy** Foundation has not responded to my communication which gave her probable ancestry to **Andreas** (through the **Andrew Jr.** line) and the reasons for believing it to be correct. Audie's relatives seem to prefer to concentrate on his Irish ancestry and several military ancestors.

Audie is one of the most decorated servicemen of World War II. Alvin York almost single-handedly captured 132

German soldiers during one WWI battle. John L. Hines and Omar N. Bradley were commanders of WWI and WWII and both served as Army chief of staff.

My local post office has informed me that the stamps will be issued in May. It is undersood that the four men will be pictured individually, but on the same sheet of stamps.

WHO ARE WE

About fifty years ago I had a record of a ballad sung in colonial style. I believe the vocalist was **John Charles Thomas**. The singer was asked "Who are you?" He replied (not a quote) that he is, and he named in a rapid succession many nationalities. The question was repeated and in reply he named many types of labor. The question was repeated and the response was many religions. In response to the repeated question the answer was "You know who I am, I am an American."

Today we Killians would

probably answer collectively in much the same manner. As I refer to **Killians** I include people of any other name in families whose children have **Killian** ancestry.

My data base of people in families whose children share common ancestry with my children now exceeds 36,000. In the last few months I have reviewed many of the notes I had about many of these people. Not everybody has a note, but still it was a massive and time consuming job. After I got started I realized that it would be interesting to summarize some of the things I noticed. Here are some of my observations,

When Were we Born? I can't give any distribution of births by month. There is one couple who were born on the same day, but different years. Just for fun I did a little research to determine how often Leap Year Day (LYD) appears in my data base. There are 15 births for LYD including one set of twins. It is curious that there are only four deaths on LYD. This disparity may result from the fact that my data base probably includes a smaller percent of the dates of deaths than that for births. People have little choice about their date of birth and death. However, they can select their wedding date. It appears that few wanted to be married on LYD. Out of well over 12,000 marriages only three were on LYD. For comparison I found the number births on 29 January (a date selected at random), it was 56. I did not check any other date for comparison. In theory there should be about four times as many born on any given day as on LYD. Thus based on 29 Jan only it appears that LYD has approximately what might be expected. 26 were married on 29 Jan. There was at least one set of triplets.

Where were we born? I will not attempt to identify all the countries of birth. However, in addition to most, if not all states, it included at least the following: Japan, China, Ethiopia, Holland, Wales, Denmark, Guam, Israel, Jerusalem, Chile, Panama, Brazil, Romania, Scotland, Korea, Iran, Thailand, Viet Nam, Lithuania, Yugoslavia and Switzerland.

Are there any with Indian ancestry? During the summer of 1999 this became a matter of interest. There are some **Killians** who claim Indian ancestry. This includes **Audie Murphy**. However I do not know who an Indian ancestor might have been. It was not his mother if I have calculated her ancestry correctly. I am told that his wife does have Indian ancestry. During my searching I noted at least three cases where an American Indian ancestor was identified for a **Killian**.

There is an interesting case wherein a child asked his/her grandfather "Where did we come from?" The response was a non response. The child was told "Never ask again!"

What is our religion? Andreas was almost surely a somewhat inactive Lutheran. Today all the major religions are represented: Catholic, Baptist, Presbyterian, Methodist, Mormon, Episcopalian, Amish, Jewish, and others. There are other religions, too, of course. I

am not sure I saw a Seventh-Day Adventist or Jehovah's Witness. Relative few people in my files are identified by religion. I assume that these, and others, are represented.

What do we do for a living? Of course until about 1900 the majority were farmers. But a substantial number were educators. In the twentieth century there are few job descriptions that are not filled by someone in my files. Not nearly all people are identified by their work, profession or education. Among those that are identified doctors and lawyers as well as educators are quite common. There are nurses, truck drivers, a stage coach driver, architects, policemen, (including at least two who died on duty). They are in every military branch. There are lots of clergymen. Several have held elective offices. Many have served in a variety of civic or public service organizations as voluntary workers. A few work for the IRS. Think of a job slightly more common than US Senator and some Killian has probably held it. **Not all Killians have Killian blood!** There are several who were adopted into a **Killian** family. There are numerous cases wherein children with no **Killian** ancestry were adopted into a **Killian** family when their parent subsequently married a **Killian**. Some were raised by grandparents, or aunts and uncles, after the death of their parents.

Have many been in jail? Relatively few are known to have been in jail. In early September 1999 one person identified a Killian, of 100 years ago, who he had heard was jailed as a counterfeiter. See also *The Killian Family Newsletter* Number 1 of 1998.

Who is the most famous Killian? The answer would probably depend upon your own interests. If you are an educator it might be the •¹. James R. Killian who served as science advisor to President Eisenhower, and President and CEO of the Massachussets Institute of Technology, one of the most prestigious technical and engineering schools in the nation. If vour interest is more in entertainment or war vou would identify Audie •²Murphy, the most decorated hero of WWII and afterwards a movie actor. Doctors, lawyers, farmers and engineers etc. might identify others. If we decide to include, among the famous, those who have studied Killian ancestry I think we would have to begin with • ³John Yates Killian and •⁴Thomas Daniel Killian from NC and GA, respectively and both of whom did extensive research and wrote on their lines well over fifty years ago. I would also like to include my own father, • Cletus Hugo Killian, who also did an outstanding job of collecting data and in doing research. And of course it was his work that inspired •⁶me to pursue **Killian** information.

Many, of course, were pioneers in this country. Andreas himself must be considered a pioneer for even coming to America. He was in PA in 1732 and in NC by about 1750 where there were still many hostile Indians. A Killian girl married a •⁷Yount and pioneered the Napa Valley of California. Indeed there is a town there named Yountville. And for that matter in Louisiana there is a town named Killian. This was surely named for George Killian, the son of Andreas. While I have not travelled extensively I have seen and heard of Killian Roads or Streets in several cities and states. Especially in this presidential election year I would like to learn of Killians in politics.

Who had the most children? Andreas may be on the short list. Twelve children were mentioned in his will. And I have suspected that there may well have been more who did not survive to adulthood. No one has ever found any so far as I know. Has anyone looked? Let's challenge our readership to identify some one who had more than 12 children. They do not all have to be by the same spouse, **Andreas**' children did not all have the same mother.

Who was the oldest Killian? I have no idea. But I suspect that it is unlikely that Andreas, at 86, was even in the top ten. Another challenge – who can identify those with Killian ancestry who lived past age 90?

In an earlier newsletter the **longest married couple** was explored. Can anyone beat **Ralph A. Killion** and **Clara Houghland** who, in 1998, completed 68 years of marriage?

Who had the most spouses? I am quite sure that I have noticed at least four. Can you identify anyone with more?

What are our given names? I have mentioned previously that Andreas is a unique name among Killians. It may also exist with other last names, and at least one **Killian** has it as a middle name. In like manner my father's name of Cletus Hugo Killian is unique. There are many names that are very common. The most common are probably John and William which are both represented more than 80 times each with Killian. This duplication of names is what makes it so important that I have a unique •⁹number associated with every individual so I can distinguish one from the other. My own name, George, has over 40 but has rarely been used for several years. There was one in 1960 and another named for one of the Beatles in 1997. There are many other interesting names wherein the parents must have decided to create a unique name by producing different spellings for more common names. And of course there are several names that leave the sex in doubt. There are several couples whose first names start with the same letter. An example it might be Anna and Albert, also Jimmie and Junerose.

How did we die? A couple were murdered. At least one died when a tree fell on him/her. There were several drownings and, unfortunately, numerous auto accidents. At least one was killed in an accident with a runaway horse. There were a few suicides and at least one infant with • ¹⁰SIDS. One spouse has been jailed for killing his **Killian** spouse.

Who are we? We surely fit "American" as described in the old ballad.

THE KILLIAN HIGH SCHOOL

In the first issue of *The Killian Family Newsletter* for 1999 mention was made of the **Killian** High School in Miami, FL. At that time your editor did not know for whom the school was named. Subsequently the information was provided. Th**Killian** school is named for **Daniel Linton Killian** [RIN 3977]. The information was provided by a granddaughter, **Jean Ann Killian Ortland**.

Daniel Linton Killian's line of descent from **Andreas** is through **John**, **Jacob**, **Daniel** and **Andrew Hall Killian**. It was **Jacob Killian** who deeded 3-acres in 1815 to Salem Church in Lincoln Co., NC.

Daniel Linton went to Miami, FL in 1916 from Memphis, TN. He started and ran a country store and was a county commissioner in Dade Co., FL.

SOME WHO HAVE RECENTLY PASSED ON

Elmore Arman Martin, Jr. [RIN 4410] Was born 6 Jun 1913 and died 24 Sep 1999. His mother was a **Killian** with ancestry going back to **Andreas** through the **Samuel C.** line. He was a graduate of the University of South Carolina with a degree in Journalism in 1934. He also attended Tulane and UCLA with a Phd in Psychology in 1946. During WWII he was in the Navy serving in Africa and Italy.

Elmore and James R Killian, Jr (who had been science advisor to President Ike, and president of MIT) were first cousins. Elmore corresponded with your editor several times and entered into a lively discussion concerning what the "R" stood for in James R Killian's •¹¹name. There was controversy concerning whether it was " **Robert**" for his father or " **Rhyne**" for his mother's maiden name.

Elmore Martin contributed considerable information about his branch of the **Killians** which added many names and data to the **Killian** data base which now includes well in excess of 26,000 people in families whose children look to **Andreas** as an ancestor.

He was a resident of Columbia SC and was a frequent attendee of the "SSS" meeting. A memorial service was held at the Unitarian church at Columbia, SC.

Mrs **Ruby Killian Jenkins** died 12 Sep 1999. Her husband had served as a former president of the **Andreas Killian** Reunion Association although he himself had no **Killian** ancestry. through **Samuel C. Killian. Fred Killian** ancestry is not known to this editor. Can anyone help?

The underlined names are those with Killian ancestry and the

underlining also indicates the name by which they are most commonly recognized.

The RIN numbers are computer generated numbers that help to identify a person and distinguish him/her from other people with the same or similar name. For example there are three **Edward Franklin** Killians mentioned herein.

SAMUEL C. KILLIAN'S DEATH by George W. Killian

.

A poor excuse is better than none! My excuse is that I receive more material than I am able to digest and all too often it gets set aside and forgotten. But it is seldom discarded.

For years my records on **Samuel C. Killian**, the tenth child of **Andreas**, has been shown in my data base as born about 1762 and died 1813. **John Yates Killian**'s *The History of the Killian Family in North Carolina* states in the •¹² second paragraph of the section about **Samuel**, "... **Samuel Killian** died in the year 1813, and is supposed to have been buried at St. Paul's Church. His land was divided among his ten children Dec. 28-30, 1813 ... "

The division of the land in late 1813 makes the death in 1813 very logical.

However, during the summer of 1998 **Nora Garrett** [RIN 4027] did some research in the Lincolnton library and found an abstract of the **Samuel C.** estate record. She obtained 75 pages from the NC archives for the complete record. She provided a copy of one page that shows **Samuel** was dead prior to 3 Jan 1808.

The document is dated 3 Jan 1808 and comprises a document that accepts **Barbara Killian** and **David Killian** as administrators of **Samuel C. Killian**, deceased.

With **Samuel** dead by 3 Jan 1808 he must have died no later than sometime in 1807.

Nora Henry Garrett traces her **Killian** ancestry back to **Samuel C. Killian** through **Samuel's** son **David**. Hopefully **Nora** has found additional data since she submitted this and will provide us with additional information for a future issue of *The Killian Family Newsletter*.

OTHER KILLIANS by George W. Killian

•

As we know **Andreas** had 12 grown children when he died and descendants of all but one of his children have been identified. Indeed I have more than 26,000 descendants, including the spouse of blood descendants. It is believed that most **Killians**, in America, are his descendants. However, we

should not lose sight of the fact that there were other **Killians** who came to America. For example There was **Henry** or **Henrich** who arrived in 1730, two years ahead of **Andreas**. **Henry** may have been two or three years older than **Andreas**. **Matheus Killian** arrived in 1741 and may have been about five years older than **Andreas**. All of these were of Palatine (German) origin, and all settled in Pennsylvania. They are not known to have been related, but there is evidence that they may have been. I have told many people that I am interested n any person in a family whose children look to **Andreas** as an ancestor. Actually I also include any family who looks to any colonial **Killian** as an ancestor. Other than**Andreas** this comprises less than 100 people in my computer. There must be many more.

One of these people is **Patricia Helen Collins** [RIN 18169] married to **Joseph Lombardo**. She has identified her ancestry as going back from her through **Helen Steward**, **Anna Killian**, **John Henry Killian**, **Jacob Killian**, and another **Jacob Killian**, **Johan Killian** and **Matheus Killian** who arrived in 1741. Incidentally **Patricia Helen Collins** was born in Philadelphia, PA. All of her named ancestors were also born in PA except the last two who were born in Germany.

Unfortunately I have not corresponded with **Patricia** in a few years. In the early 1990s she was searching out her ancestry in both the United States and in Germany. In 1995 she visited Germany and I quote a note she sent in 1995:

"Our trip to Germany was better than we had hoped. The country is beautiful, the people warm and helpful, and the food delicious. I did not find any more information about **Matheus Killian** but we visited Heilbronn and **St. Kilian**'s church. It is now a Lutheran Church but surely was Catholic when built. It was begun in 1020, completed in 1529. The name**Kilian** appears every where, streets, shops and millions of **Kilians** in the phone book.

I have joined the Palatines in America, PA chapter and hope to find help thru them. My promise to myself in '96 is to gather more information and hopefully connect these 2 men." End Quote.

It is my personal hope that sometime someone will identify

the relationship between the colonial **Killians**, or determine that there is no relationship. Note that **Patricia** indicates that **Kilian** is a common name in Germany.
