

New findings in Germany - continued from the February 2011 Newsletter

Who was the Georg Kilian living in Steinbach an der Holzecke at the same time as North Carolina pioneer Andreas?

At the 2009 reunion I showed burial records from the Saint Gallus Church in Erzberg of Georg Kilian and his wife Eva. This Georg was buried on 10 August 1723 and his record said he lived in Steinbach and was 76 years old at his death ¹. This means he was born in 1647.

Since the reunion I learned from their children's baptismal records that Eva's maiden name was Eyßin and Georg had an earlier wife named Barbara, whose maiden name was not mentioned. The various records describe Georg as a farmer and as a Köbler. From the dates it is assumed Barbara died either in childbirth in 1685, or at the latest before November 1686.

Georg Kilian and first known wife Barbara had the following children:

- 1. Georg, baptized 1 April 1673².
- 2. NN, baptized and died 16 February 1674 ^{3.}
- 3. Andreas, baptized 1 December 1675 4.
- 4. Johann Georg, baptized 13 June 1676^{5.}
- 5. Martha, baptized 11 December 1679 6.
- 6. Barbara, baptized 5 November 1680 7. (apparently died young)
- 7. Barbara, baptized 8 December 1681 8.
- 8. Jacob, baptized 1 March 1683 9.
- 9. Johann Lorenz, baptized 1 March 1683 ^{10.}
- 10. Johan Jacob Lorenz, baptized 30 May 1684 ¹¹.
- 11. Hannß Lorenz, baptized 14 January 1685 ¹².

Jacob and Johann Lorenz were twins born 15 minutes apart between 4:00 and 5:00 AM. The pastor wrote in the church book that he was called to the house for an emergency baptism because of "great weakness". Johann Lorenz was born first and then Jacob. Both were named for their Godfather who was a schoolmaster.

Georg Kilian and second known wife Eva Eyßin had the following children:

- 1. Margaretha, baptized 6 July 1687 ¹³.
- 2. Johann Michael, baptized 6 December 1688 ^{14.}
- 3. Johann Martin, baptized 27 October 1690 ^{15.}

Who this Georg was remained a mystery until I discovered a record of an earlier marriage between Andreas' grandfather Georg Kilian and Ursula Raysigs ^{16.} on the 20th of February 1642 in Triensbach. They lived in Lobenhausen where they had five children. Ursula died ^{17.} on the 9th of July 1649, a week after her twins Leonhard and Maria were baptized:

- 1. Ursula, baptized 9 April 1644 ^{18.}
- 2. Johannes, baptized 16 November 1645 ^{19.}
- 3. Georg, baptized 31 January 1647 ²⁰.
- 4. Leonhard, baptized 2 July 1649 ²¹.
- 5. Maria, baptized 2 July 1649 ^{22.}

Georg had a marginal note in his baptismal record that he died in Steinbach on the 8th of August

17?3. The penultimate digit was illegible. He died in another village 26 kilometers from Lobenhausen and it is not known who initiated the entry or when. But it was entered into his baptismal record at least 76 years after his birth.

The Georg Kilian who lived in Steinbach an der Holzecke was buried on the 10th of August 1723 ²³. His burial record said he was 76 years old and this meant he was born in 1647. Burials normally took place three days, or sooner, after death. This means one would expect Georg was born between the 7th and 10th of August 1647. This conforms to the marginal note mentioned in the record of Georg Kilian, baptized in Triensbach on the 8th of August 1647, and indicates they are the same person.

The conclusion is: This Georg Kilian was the half-brother of the North Carolina pioneer Andreas Killian's father. The fourteen children of Georg and the fourteen children of Andreas' father, all living in the tiny village of Steinbach an der Holzecke, were half-first-cousins. The mystery is finally solved.

This is the conclusion of this series, "News From the Killian Homeland", but not the end of research and reports from William Randolph McCreight. Mr. McCreight had spent years trying to track down the homeland of Andreas by researching the many family legends of Andreas' birthplace. From the 1930s and J. Yates Killian until 2007, we did not know who Andreas' father was. With one clue in 2007, Mr. McCreight tracked down documentaion and he will be one of our key speakers at this year's reunion. If you missed the 2009 and 2010 reunions, this year's reunion is one not to miss. On Saturday afternoon, Mr. McCreight will be one of our key speakers, The Kilians in Germany, ca. 1560-1732. You will see photos of the place Andreas married, the house where Andreas probably lived, and the church were Andreas was baptized. You will be presented with proof Mr. McCreight found the correct Andreas Killian in Germany and his forefathers back to the 16th century.

The Forefathers of North Carolina pioneer Andreas Killian By William Randolph McCreight Published by Andreas Killian Descendants Historical Association

William Randolph McCreight has written 3 books on the Origin of the Kilian family of Mittelfranken, Bavaria, Germany. The first was in 2009, *The Origin of the Kilians in Germany*. Then in 2010, he wrote *Where did we – the Kilians- originate?*. In his search for related Kilians still living in Germany, he wrote letters to all Kilians living within a 20 mile radius of the villages where he found Kilian records. One gentleman, Walter Kilian, proved to be the needle in the haystack. As a result of Mr. McCreight's tenacity, a modern German relative of Andreas Killian was found and finally proves the European origins of this American family. In 2011, with these new discoveries, his third book, titled *The Forefathers of North Carolina pioneer Andreas Killian*, was finished and written for publication by the Andreas Killian Descendants Historical Association.

This book begins with *The historical setting in Germany leading up to the time of Andreas Kilian* and the *Ethnicity of Bavaria and Württemberg where the Kilians lived*. The chronicle of Andreas forefathers begins with the patriarch Sebastian Kilian, a farmer in Kühnhard, born before 1560, and ends with his great-great-great grandchildren living in America in the 1700s. Sebastian was the great-great-grandfather of the immigrant Andreas Kilian who settled in North Carolina, west of the Catawba River, before 1749. Proof of the *Fatherland* of our North Carolina Killian family has been found through DNA testing and links descendants of Andreas to a modern day German Kilian family in Schainbach.

Back to Andreas, I'm looking for your connection

Our pioneer ancestor came from Germany on the ship Adventure. Landing at Philadelphia where he took the oath of allegiance September 23, 1732.He came to North Carolina about 1749 and later established a home about two miles northwest of here (Old St Paul's Church). I am always looking for new connections to descendants of Andreas Killian. The following is a suggested format to list your ancestors from Andreas to yourself.

Looking for the connection to Andreas Killian

In my database there are 74,123 people. They have something in common with me and most have something in common with you; most have a connection to Andreas. I work each week searching the internet for what I call "Missing Killians". Yet, they are not missing, their link in my database is missing.

Can you help find the connection back to the family tree for the following "Missing Killians"?

What is the Killian ancestry of **Patsy Lee Killian** who married Billy Joe Dockery, 21 Oct 1961? They have a daughter Tammy Letusia Dockery born 21 Aug 1962 in Guilford County and a son William Glenn Dockery born 28 Feb 1964 in Davidson County, NC. With that much information, it looks like I would know who her parents are.

Who was the **Mr. Killian** who married Mary Elizabeth Stewart (daughter of Emmanuel Stewart and Lucinda Byers? He died before 1910. His wife was born 6 Apr 1885, died 7 Jul 1970, Catawba County, North Carolina. The marriage would probably have been around 1903-1905. They had one known son, **John Anderson Killian**, born 19 Jun 1905 and died 6 Oct 1977, Iredell Hospital. John Anderson Killian was listed as informant, living at Rt. 1, Hickory in 1970 when his mother died. At the time of her death Mary Elizabeth Stewart was the widow of her second husband, Franklin W. Frye. She is buried Hudson Chapel, Catawba County, NC. John Anderson Killian had a daughter named Pearl, who may have been a twin.

Pearl Virginia Killian, born 29 Sep 1906, Catawba County, NC. She married (1926-27) Robert Tate Pope (son of George W. Pope & Frances Sipe), b. 16 Oct 1885, d. 27 Sep 1971, Catawba Memorial Hosp. He was a carpenter. She had a daughter, Frances, born about 1928. I believe Frances is living and I would like to know the names of her Killian grandparents.

Florence Eckard Killian, b. 24 Jan 1918, Burke County, NC, died. 30 Sep 1997 in Frye Regional Medical Center, Hickory. She was the widow of a **Mr. Killian**. Who was he?

An Oklahoma mystery is **Jimmy Clay Hooper** (#46166), a descendant of Leonard Killian. He was born 19 May 1925 in Logan County, Ark., and died 8 Jul 1995 at Okemah, Oklahoma. Reportedly married three times, his first wife was **Johnny Fay Killian**, ancestry unknown.

While people might know some of the above, the following "Missing Killians" are a little more difficult.

Who was the father of **John Killian**, #70392 b. abt 1788, a miner in Burke County, NC on 1850 census? This unidentified John Killian married Elizabeth "Betsy" Bean in Burke County, in 1815 and had seven known children. The oldest was Thomas Killian who married Elizabeth Webb, 6 May 1839 in Burke County, NC. Also, he was most likely the John Killian who served in the War of 1812 with 1st Regt. Burke County, NC. This John is not the John who was in Habersham County, Georgia in 1850 with his sister, Mary Jane and brother-in-law John Smart and their three daughters. The Habersham County John is Andreas' grandson, son of Daniel Killian, Sr.

Who was the father of **Sarah Killian Teague**, #37640, born about 1785, probably in Burke County, NC. Sarah and Michael Teague moved and there is some uncertainty as to when, but Michael Teague died in Indiana around 1845. They had nine children, all supposedly born in Lincoln County (remembered the Catawba River, etc.), between 1810 and about 1828. Sarah Killian Teague died in Texas during the Civil War.

Three Children of Albert Otto Killian Passed Away

On May 2, 2011, Norman William Killian, son of Albert Otto and Cora Virginia (Sipe) Killian died at age 91 years (b. 1919) following a prior extended stay at the Lutheran Home on Springs Road, Hickory, NC. At that time Norman's living brothers were Ray Allen Killian and Billy Otto Killian, and he had one living sister, Pauline (Killian) Kiziah. Norman's gravesite is near his beloved parents at Mt. Zion Lutheran Church, Conover, NC.

On May 4, 2011, Pauline Virginia (Killian) Kiziah died at 95 years of age following a few years of residing at the Springs Road Lutheran Home. Pauline was the third daughter of Albert and Cora Killian. At her death, her living siblings were brothers, Ray of Charlotte, NC and Billy of Raleigh, NC. Pauline is survived by her three children; Nancy Sigmon of Chattanooga, TN, Judy Brittain of Conover, NC, Dave Kiziah of Conover, NC, and her four grandchildren. Pauline's gravesite is near her beloved parents at Mt. Zion.

On July 6, 2011, Billy Otto Killian, born Oct 3, 1927, youngest son of Albert and Cora, died at age 83 while residing at Sunrise Assisted Living in Raleigh, NC. At his death, his living sibling is Ray Allen Killian of Charlotte, NC. Billy is survived by his three children; Richard Esley Killian, Thomas William Killian of Summit, NJ, and Cynthia Allen Killian of Raleigh, NC, and five grandchildren. Funeral services were held at the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Raleigh on July 9, 2011. Interment, Oleander Memorial Gardens alongside his deceased wife, Betty Sue (Dedmon) Killian, in Wilmington, NC.

Albert and Cora had eight children: Elsie Viola, Clara Ruth, Gaither McDewey, Pauline Virginia, Paul Albert, Norman William, Ray Allen, and Billy Otto.

In 2007, Ray, Pauline, and Billy attended the Killian Family Reunion held at the Mr. Zion Lutheran Church in Conover, NC.

DANIEL LINTON KILLIAN

Dade County (Florida) Killians Submitted by William Hinds

Daniel Linton Killion was born on 9 Feb 1871 in Egypt, Chickasaw County, Mississippi. He was the son of Andrew Hall Killian and Mary Caroline Brown, and a great, great grandson of North Carolina pioneer Andreas Killian. He grew up on the family farm where he was born. After completing public school, he entered Normal College in Buena Vista, MS where he received his A. B. degree. Daniel married Mary Elizabeth Moore and they lived in Memphis, TN.

Daniel enjoyed success in both wholesale and retail selling. He was active in his community and became a Master Mason. Together with a partner, he owned and operated a chain of grocery stores with some involvement in real estate. Daniel was left "holding the bag" when his partner walked off with the funds. This event brought on a nervous breakdown and his brother-in-law, Dr. Alfred Moore, suggested he go to Florida and get his health back.

Upon arriving in Miami, Daniel went to see a Mr. Rompf at the First National Bank, who suggested that he go to a small town south of Miami and buy a building to open a store. The year was 1916, Daniel Killian went to Larkins. He bought a nice house on Sunset Drive (now called Southwest 72nd Street) for his

family. In surveying other possibilities, he discovered the Hinson store in Kendall. The store was operated by the Mitchell brothers; Daniel bought it from them in 1917.

At first, Daniel commuted back and forth, but decided it would be better if he lived nearer the store. He purchased a corner lot south of the store. He hired some men to build a house on the corner and a duplex in the center of the lot.

At the store (about 20 ft. by 20 ft.), he traded and bartered with the Native American Indians, who lived, trapped, and farmed nearby. Many times he let them take whatever merchandise they needed with the understanding they would pay him when their crops were harvested. It has been said that they were very honest and "never did him out of a dime". ("The Villages of South Dade," by Jean Taylor.)

Daniel and Mary M. Killian's four children were all born in Memphis. The eldest, Alfred Daniel Killian, was namesake of Mary's brother, Dr. Alfred Moore. The second born was namesake of her father, George. In 1902, 22 month old George died. The third child was Mary Moore Killian and she married a Mr. Henderson. The fourth child was Virginia Killian and she married Lock Graham.

Daniel Linton Killian was deeply interested in and committed to his community. This soon became apparent to his friends and neighbors. He was elected to the County Commission in 1922 and served until 1926. At that time there were five members of the Dade County Commission. Those four years were a real boom period in the history of Dade County. Sometimes, Daniel Killian was the swing vote that determined key issues concerning growth and development. Kendall benefitted from their selection.

As a County Commissioner, Daniel was in charge of naming the various roads in the district.

- The unofficial boundaries of the town were Southwest 88th Street, (which was the surveyors' dividing line between Townships 54 and 55, Range 40 East) on the north and Southwest.
- 104th Street (the north boundary of the land granted in 1897 by the family of Dr. Henry Perrine, a well known botanist who was murdered by Indians on Indian Key in 1840) on the south.
- ♦ 104th Street (South Kendall Drive) was named in honor of the Englishman Henry J. B. Kendall. Over the years, the name "South Kendall Drive" has fallen into disuse in favor of 104th St., but the name "Kendall" became permanently associated with the area. The Kendall area suffered severe damages in a hurricane in 1937. In August 1992, Hurricane Andrew hit south Dade County with widespread damage.

Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Moore Killian was the daughter of Dr. George Henry Moore, who served as a surgeon in the Civil War. Her younger brother, Alfred Moore, was also a medical doctor. Mrs. Killian was deeply committed to her community. In 1922, she was the leader of a religious group that held services in an old shop on Elizabeth Street, west of the Killian store in Kendall. From that group, the Kendall Methodist Church was organized and Rev. C. H. Kutch was appointed circuit pastor. They met in a blacksmith shop and later in the train depot before Mr. Richard Rice gave them a lot on Smoak Road where they built a small frame sanctuary. In 1926, when Rev. C. E. Cray was pastor, a hurricane demolished the building. It was replaced the following year. In 1929, following the collapse of the land boom, many in the congregation became penniless and others left the community. The church closed its doors; the doors were reopened in 1946 with six families. In 1950, the small congregation acquired land at the corner of 104th Street and 77th Avenue and continued to grow throughout the years that followed.

Daniel L. Killian was instrumental in getting a county charity hospital and also, a home for old folks, delinquent children and orphanage, built at SW 107th Avenue and 80th Street. In 1924, when the building was nearly completed and moving day loomed, someone belatedly discovered that there was no electricity in Kendall. Daniel Killian persuaded the Miami Electric Light and Power Company to run some lines that far south. According to The Miami News, Daniel Killian promised, "This will not only furnish light and power to the county institution but will be used by the people of Kendall and will supply lights at needed points along the public highway." At the time the "public highways" were narrow, potholed cart tracks which hardly justified the installation of expensive street lights. The coming of electric power to Kendall provided a jolt for growth.
