I hereby appoint them ustees of the same.".

From then on down to the esent time as a trustee died moved away another truse was selected by those reaining and the three would vern the property.

After 126 years, the buildas stand in good repair. The arding house is used as a mmunity center and reunion te. It is furnished with tebellum furniture and accesries. Many articles of clothg of by-gone days are on splay.



## **Chester Native** To Retire


Lt. Col. Blair Knox, formerly of Chester, plans to retire from active duty with the U. S.
