THE HEALING SPRINGS OF BROAD RIVER

While the healing properties of the spring water found in Shelton were well known locally, Mr. N. F. Shivar took things a step further. In 1907, two years after spending some time in Shelton, and after having married the owner of the property, Shivar began bottling the water commercially. Soon after, he began producing Shivar's ginger ale with the water. A total of four springs were eventually involved, with the water being pumped into large cisterns located centrally in Shelton. The cisterns can still be seen. All of this is of course now part of the ghost town of Shelton.

If you make it to Feasterville, you will find Shelton only a few miles away.

FIELD TRIP TO THE SPRING

Two tours are scheduled, with starting times a little flexible.

In dry weather, the spring is only a very short walk from parking your car. In wet weather, best to walk the 3/4 of a mile from the road.

Bryan Greer will host each of the tours. He has made the effort to obtain the land owner's permission, and is also caught up on the history of the spring. In fact, he will have information about the current plans to start bottling this water again. The spring is on the property of Freddie McConnell.

Tour 1 will be held on Saturday afternoon, beginning around 3 p.m., and will get organized on the grounds of the Boarding House. Meet with Bryan and have the appropriate walking gear.

Tour 2 will begin on Sunday, after the meetings and meal have concluded. This should be around 3 p.m.

This is not an idle spring, as Bryan estimates that it is flowing about a gallon of water per minute.

CANOE AND KAYAK TRIP DOWN THE BROAD RIVER by Bryan Greer

For the adventurous, we will attempt to paddle an approximate 6-8 mile section of the Broad River on Saturday of this year's reunion, putting in at Shelton and taking out at either Blair or Strother (to be determined, depending on the flow rate). Saturday being October 5, of course. The trip is subject to weather and river conditions, and if not safe, then the trip will be cancelled. The officer-in-charge is Bryan Greer. Bryan will be assisted by James Green and by Eddie Killian.

Sites and features along the way are a fantastic stretch of undeveloped riverfront including Shelton and Henderson Islands, Lyles Ford, Henderson Island fish dam, railway trestle crossing the Broad, an old sunken ferry from the early 20th century (visible if water level is down), Blair Mound, Tyger and Enoree Rivers, Beaver and Rocky Creeks, and many birds, possible including eagles and osprey.

We will meet at the Boarding House at 9:00 a.m. in preparation for vehicle placement and boat shuttle to the put in spot, for a 10:00 a.m. cast off.

Canoe, kayak, or raft (We may be able to provide 1 or 2 kayaks if you do not have one, and we will also have 2 canoes available for use, with one holding 2 and the other 3 passengers. Call Bryan Greer ASAP to reserve.)

FAIRFIELD COUNTY MUSEUM


