

Tomb of the Unknown Soldier

1. How many steps does the guard take during his walk across the tomb of the Unknowns and why?

21 steps.

It alludes to the twenty-one-gun salute, which is the highest honor given any military or foreign dignitary.



- 2. How long does he hesitate after his about face to begin his return walk and why?
- 21 seconds for the same reason as answer number 1



3. Why are his gloves wet?

His gloves are moistened to prevent his losing his grip on the rifle.



4. Does he carry his rifle on the same shoulder all the time and if not, why not?

He carries the rifle on the shoulder away from the tomb. After his march across the path, he executes an about face and moves the rifle to the outside shoulder.




5. How often are the guards changed?

Guards are changed every thirty minutes, twenty-four hours a day, 365 days a year.

6. What are the physical traits of the guard limited to?

For a person to apply for guard duty at the tomb, he must be between 5' 10" and 6' 2" tall and his waist size cannot exceed 30." Other requirements of the Guard: They must commit 2 years of life to guard the tomb, live in a barracks under the tomb, and cannot drink any alcohol on or off duty for the rest of their lives. They cannot swear in public for the rest of their lives and cannot disgrace the uniform {fighting} or the tomb in any way. After two years, the guard is given a wreath pin that is worn on their lapel signifying they served as guard of the tomb. There are only 400 presently worn. The guard must obey these rules for the rest of their lives or give up the wreath pin. The shoes are specially made with very thick soles to keep the heat and cold from their feet. There are metal heel plates that extend to the top of the shoe to make the loud click as they come to a halt. There are no wrinkles, folds, or lint on the uniform. Guards dress for duty in front of a full-length mirror. The first six months of duty a guard cannot talk to anyone, nor watch TV. All off duty time is spent studying the 175 notable people laid to rest in Arlington National Cemetery . A guard must memorize who they are and where they are interred. Among the notables are President Taft, Joe E. Lewis {the boxer} and Medal of Honor winner Audie Murphy, {the most decorated soldier of WWII} of Hollywood fame. Every guard spends five hours a day getting his uniforms ready for guard duty.

In 2003 as Hurricane Isabelle was approaching Washington , DC , our US Senate/House took 2 days off with anticipation of the storm. On the ABC evening news, it was reported that because of the dangers from the hurricane, the military members assigned the duty of guarding the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier were given permission to suspend the assignment. They respectfully declined the offer, "No way, Sir!" Soaked to the skin, marching in the pelting rain of a tropical storm, they said that guarding the Tomb was not just an assignment, it was the highest honor that can be afforded to a serviceperson. The tomb has been patrolled continuously, 24/7, since 1930.

Lebanon (Old Jackson Creek) Presbyterian (Old Stone) Church

Lebanon (old Jackson Creek) Presbyterian (Old Stone) Church Manse (preacher's home) with its ancient marble stones is located on Jackson Creek Road just north of Jackson Creek. At one time there was a path or wagon road between this nearby Manse to the church.




Lebanon (old Jackson Creek) Presbyterian (Old Stone) Church is one of Fairfield's oldest Scots Irish Presbyterian churches. The church is located nearby about six miles west of Winnsboro on State Road 38 (old Airport Road) between Jackson Creek Road and SC Highway #34. The church ruins with its hauntingly beautiful ancient marble slabs and vaults describe many of the buried as having immigrated from the Ulster Irish counties.

When the Church became unsafe to hold worship, the church congregation was moved about two miles northwest to the site of the present Lebanon Presbyterian Church.





Monument to Lieutenant James Clark

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This monument is on the left side of the old church. The inscription has been broken but said:

To The Memory of Lieutenant James Clark of Company G. Palmetto Regiment South Carolina Volunteers In Mexico He was born October 1st 1815 In 1836 He Served As A Volunteer in Florida And in 1847 in Mexico In the Memorable Battle of Cherubusco On the 20th of August 1847 As Commander of his Company And while leading it on to Victory he received A shot in the Forehead and fell exclaiming "Onward Men, Onward Remember where you came from" Thus ended the brief though Brilliant career of One Of Fairfield's Bravest Sons

There are several graves that are in a survey taken in 1991 that were not found. These are:

Elizabeth Brice – died 1848, infant daughter of John G. & Jeanette Brice Mary Brice – died 8/15/1855, daughter of John & Mary Brice James Turner Martin – died 9/19/1817 at age of 20 years Mary Milling – died 1/29/1839 at the age of 3 years Robinson – Broken stone on ground Eleanor Robinson – stone broken – illegible William Robinson – died ?/15/1835, husband of Martha

The grave locations start at the right as you enter the gate. Gaps in the numbers indicate vacant spaces or graves marked with only fieldstones.




Micajah Pickett Plat Book B2 Page 1 1809





Michael J. McCarty, b.c.1784 and thought to have died about 1825 leaving a widow Margaret Byrd and several orphan children. The widow and family moved to Georgia and received land in the Georgia Lottery. Michael J. McCarty is a 37-marker match with Daniel Sterling McCarty. This match indicates that there is a 98.26% probability that they shared a common ancestor within 180 years. They appear to be uncle and nephew.

John McCarty, b. c. 1813 is also a perfect match of 37-markers. John McCarty married Caroline Raiford of Edgefield, moved to Covington Co., Alabama by 1850 then Macon Georgia by 1855.

James H. McCarty, b. 1784, Edgefield is also a 37-marker match. With this pattern of perfect matches, two generations of these families have taken shape.

An important addition to this group is that of descendants of Edward McCarty b.1773, who is also 37 marker match with all of these men. These results support the popular belief that all of these men were children or brothers of Michael McCarty b. 1754 Edgefield, South Carolina, since paper research indicates that the father of Edward McCarty was, indeed, Michael McCarty.
