
need to show up. Please be aware that no detergents or bleaches will be used We will be cleaning on Friday morning, July 28. Weather permitting.

on a motorcycle but, I got the lecture "just in case". Oh, and the only time my brother ever got a spanking was when he rode a motorcycle after my father told him not to.

I was compared to my brother a lot growing up. He was killed in a car accident when I was only three years old. The only memory I have of him was when he threw me up in the air and I came down behind his head. He caught me by my feet. I was too young to ask him to do it again and years later, my mother said that it scared her to death and my brother never tossed me up again.

I remember my Granny Stone when I see fried chicken and biscuits. We didn't have very much growing up so my mother prepared my daddy's lunch to take to work every day. He had one of those black lunchboxes with a red thermos that fit in the curved lid. This one particular day, my mother made fried chicken and biscuits and gravy. The leftovers were for daddy's lunch. I didn't know that. Nobody told me. So, I thought of Granny Stone and took the leftovers to her. She lived two houses up from us on the same street. started eating right away. In a few minutes., mama called. They didn't know I had left the house. I thought I was in big trouble but, because I didn't realize I had done anything wrong, I just got a "talking to". Sometimes, those talks were worse than a whipping.

Pictures I see online of fine ladies walking down the streets of Atlanta back in the 1930's or 40's remind me of my Aunt Chris. I have one of those photos of her with her pretty dress and beads on. There used to be photographers that were on the streets and sold the photos to their passing subjects. I'm glad she bought this one.

I don't know why today was a nostalgic day. It may be because they are tearing down our local Chick-fil-A restaurant. They will rebuild it in the same location but, it will be closer to the property line and will assist with the double drive-thru line and will supply additional parking. The memory associated with this restaurant is the time that my son, Adam, spent working there. He worked whenever they asked and did anything they asked. He was working toward a scholarship which never cam He didn't have enough hours worked to qualify.

Adam loved the Air Force JROTC and desperately wanted to join the Air Force after high school. He was in the service two years before I got that awful Tuesday morning call telling me that he had been killed in an accident.



It's amazing the things which cause memories to pop up unexpectedly. Smells, food buildings, music, or places like the beach or the mountains. When I think of my Aunt Wilma, I think of the delicious coconut cakes she made from her fresh chicken eggs and milk from their farm. When I see a U.S. flag, I think of my son who volunteered for the Air Force while still in high school JROTC. A man's hat causes me to immediately go to my daddy who was never seen outside without his hat with a tiny feather in the band. A look at my own hands reminds me of holding my mother's protective hand as a child and again when I saw her for the last time as she lay dying of cancer or changing my children's diapers and picking up toys. Songs from the 1970's bring me back to high school and riding around town with my friend, Susan. Susan was a little older than me but, my parents knew her and her family so she was trustworthy for their daughter to hang around with. Motorcycles remind me of the lecture I got from my father when I went on a date with a boy that had a motorcycle. He didn't pick me up
