

#### Graduation





Miss FCHS Pageant is an annual event held in the FCHS auditorium. With 26 contestants in all; only one would come out as Miss FCHS.







# English


The English department here at Fairfield Central High School is dedicated to teach each student about the world. English can help you advance in college and communication. It enhances listening skills and the ability to speak well.

The goal of the English Department is to implement the program through a variety of resources. The second goal is to creatively communicate and to culturally participate in their environment.


As students go through their four years of English, we hope that they will be able to communicate better. English will also help you become a better person in the future.








#### Mathematics






### Science





### Social Studies







## Foreign Language











#### Music



## Computer Science and Technology














## Cafeteria & Custodial Staff

### New Teachers







#### Administration








### Future Business Leaders of America








#### Distributive Education Clubs of America








Beta Club members are known for more than just academics. This year the Beta Club participated in two service projects: the Good Samaritan House and the Muscular Dystrophy Drive.


# Fellowship of Christian Athletes








Above: The Griffin offense runs onto the field after an excellent stand by the defensive unit.














#### **Layout Design**
