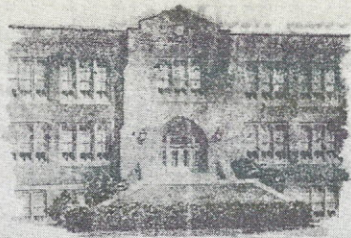

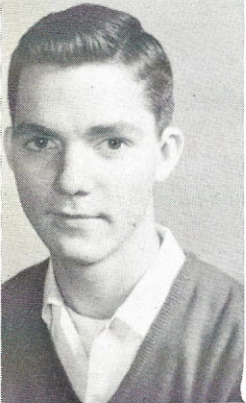

Friday night, the talent show will be held at the Township Auditorium. There will be about seven or eight clubs participating in the show, each one presenting a skit or musical talent by members of their club.

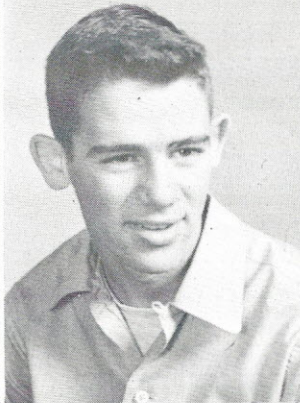

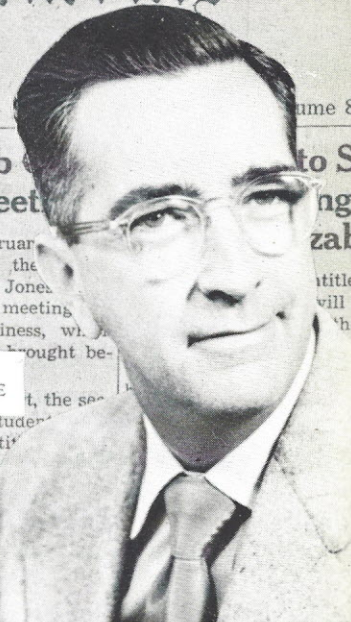

French Club Play at Meeting

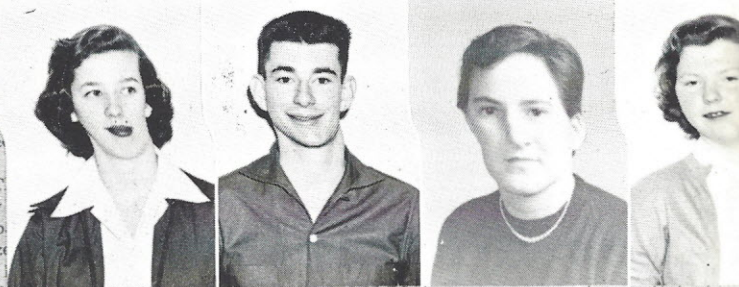
On Thursday, February 2, the monthly meeting of the French Club was held in Mr. Jones' room. The first part of the meeting was devoted to the business, which was brought before the club.
