This band, the oldest high school band in North Carolina, has been in continuous progress since it was organized in March, 1924. It has taken part in all state contests, when eligible to com-

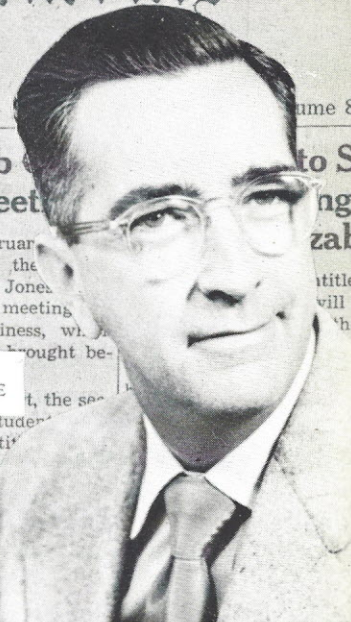

Again this year we let our dramatic inclinations come to the surface and presented Ring Around Elizabeth. And the high point of the whole year was the banquet and dance given us by the Junior Class.

And now the history of the Class of 1956 is nearing the end. In a few more days, our graduation will be over. It doesn't seem possible that the work of five years has been completed so quickly.
