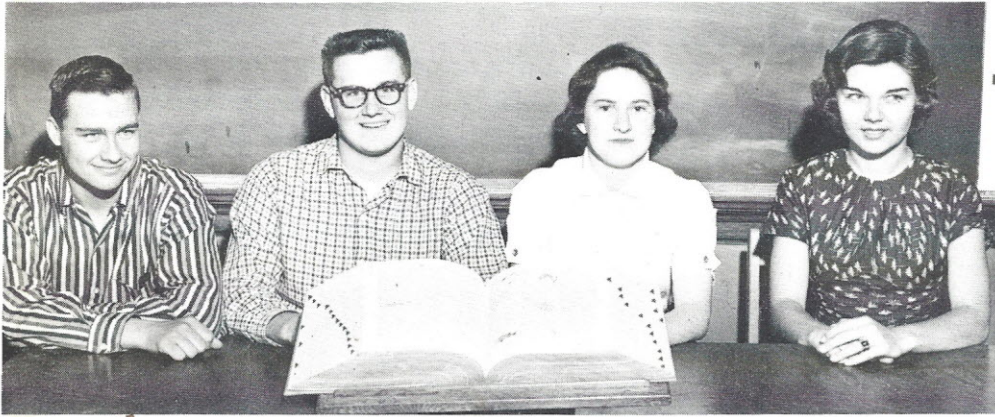
ACTIVITIES

The agenda for the remaining days of May included Class Night, May 17, Baccalaureate Sermon, May 19, and Commencement exercises, May 21.

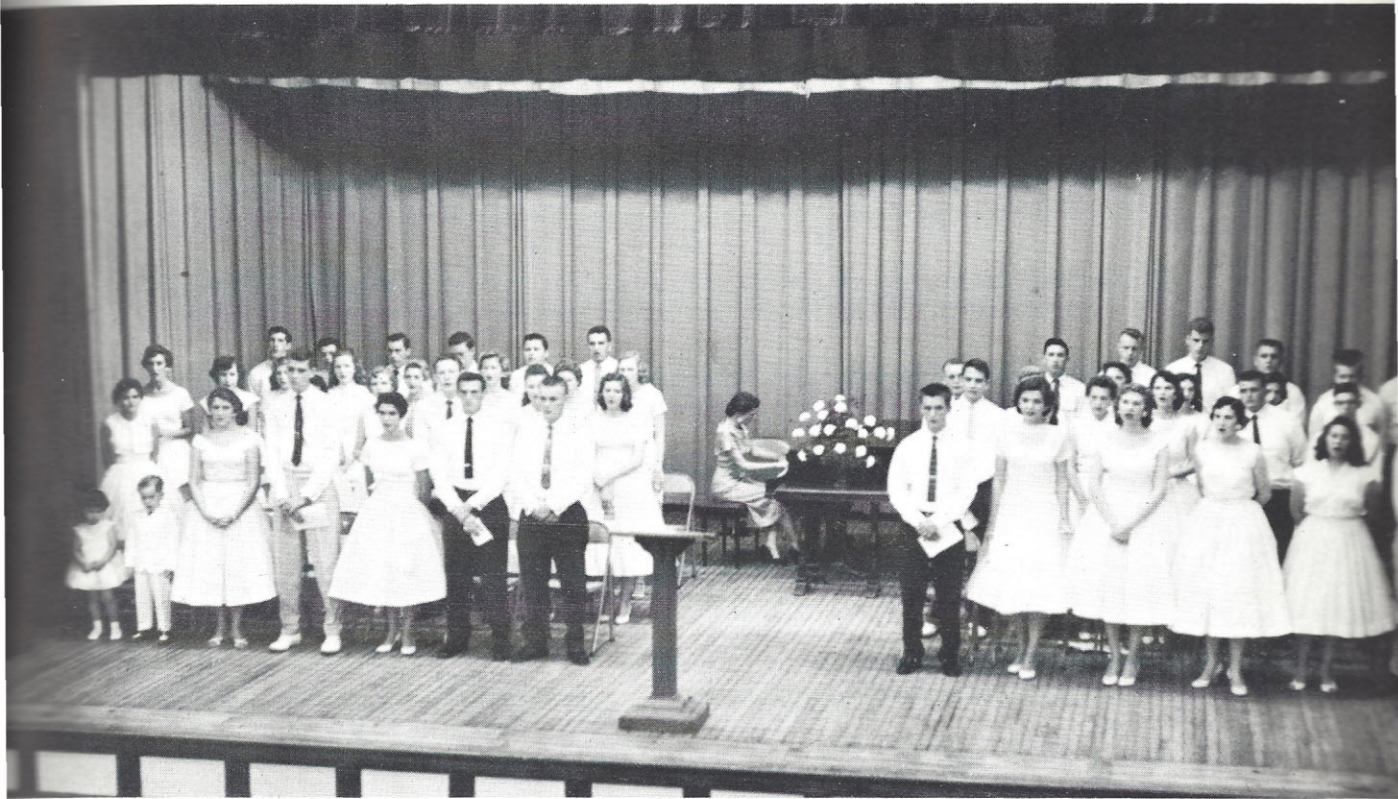
