

Old Brick Church



Ebenezer Church, or the Old Brick Church, was built in 1788. It is often called the birthplace of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church in South Carolina. The bricks for the walls were hand made by members of the congregation, who also constructed the church and built the furniture. During the Civil War, Union soldiers used flooring from the church to build a bridge across the river. A Union soldier penciled a note of apology for desecrating the church. The message may still be read in the door frame.
