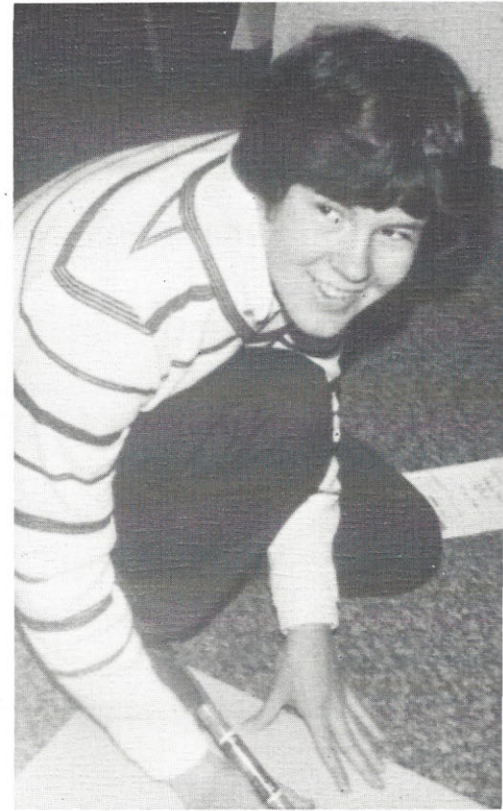
"Each day means challenge . . .

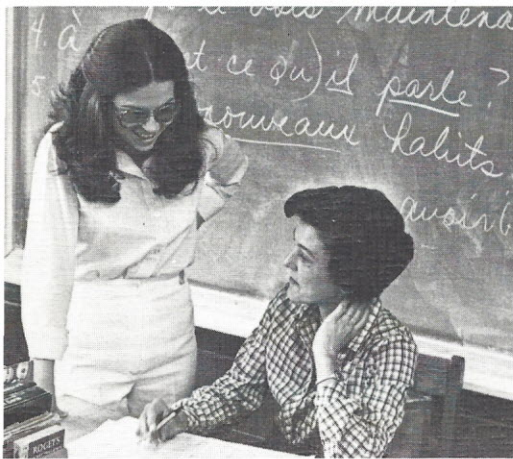
