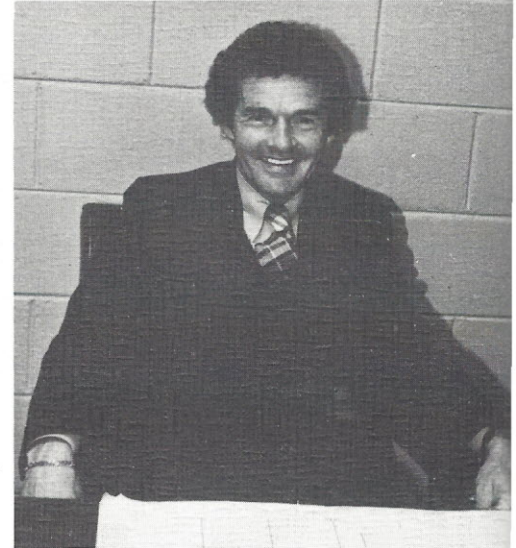
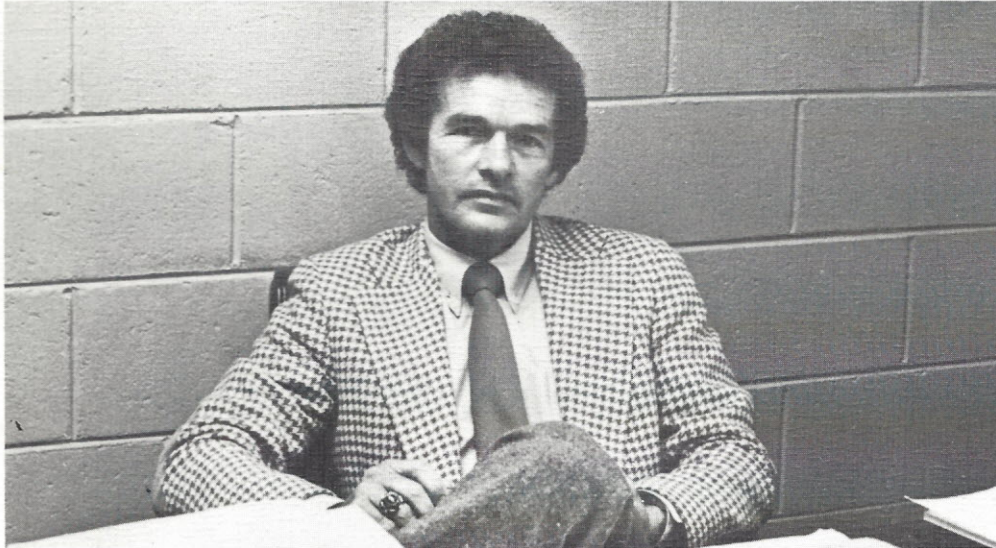


Board and Administration

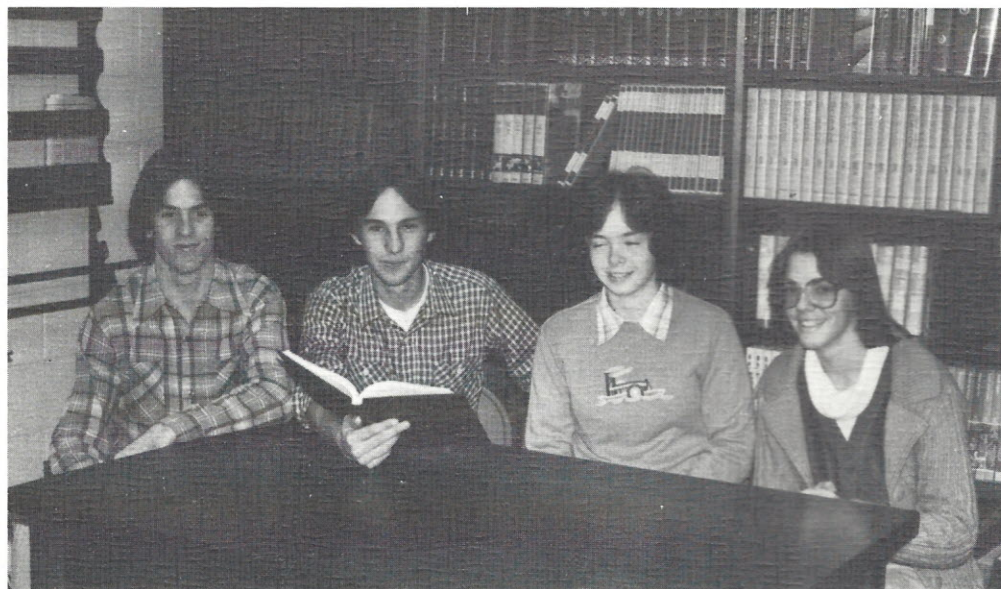
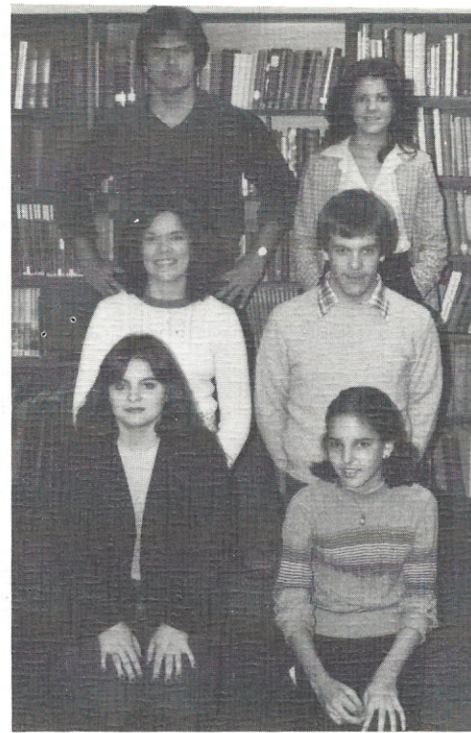
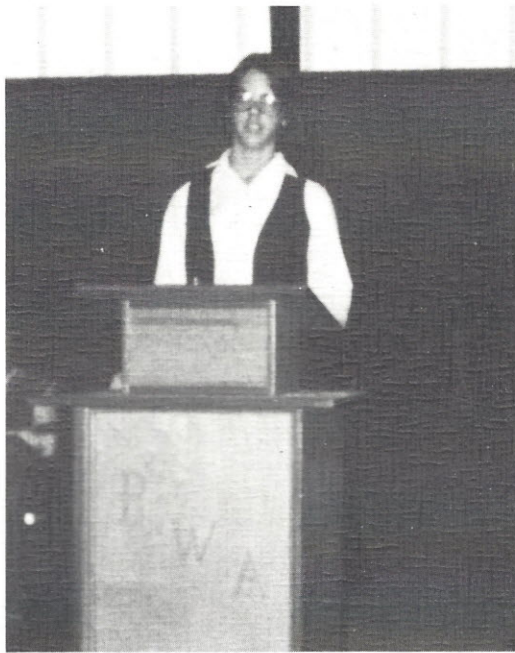




Student Council

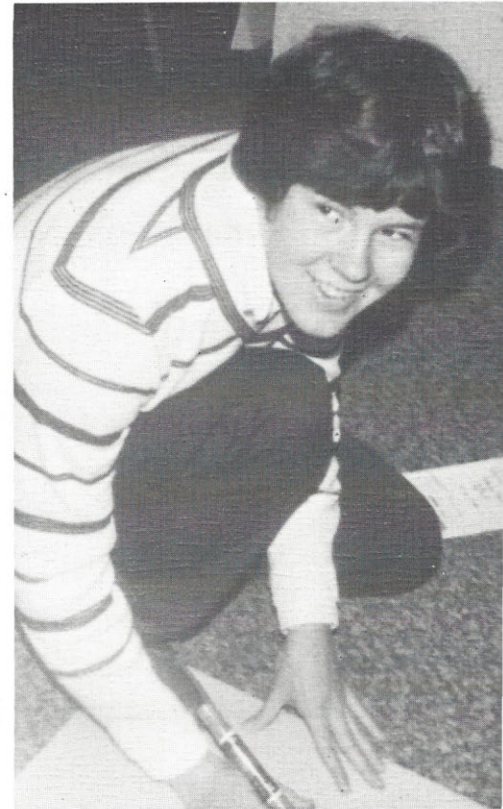
The Aerie

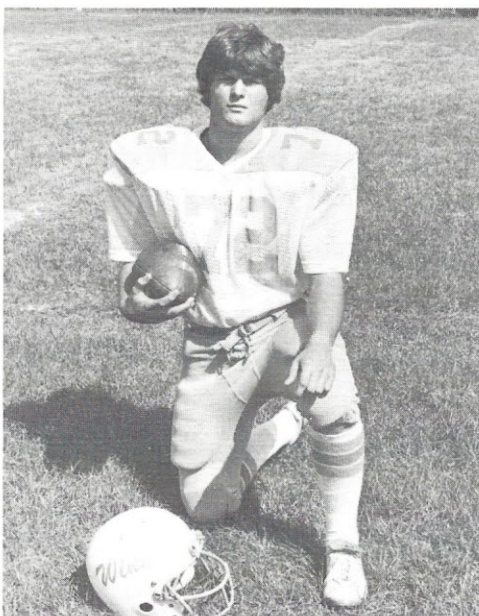
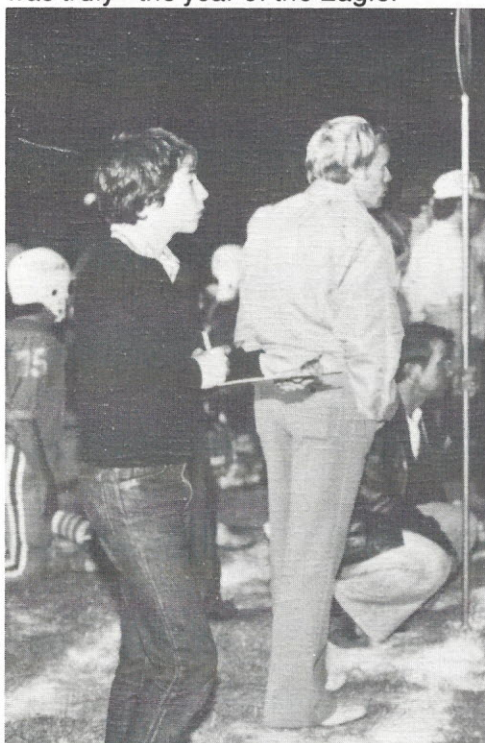


Eagles Soar to Victory

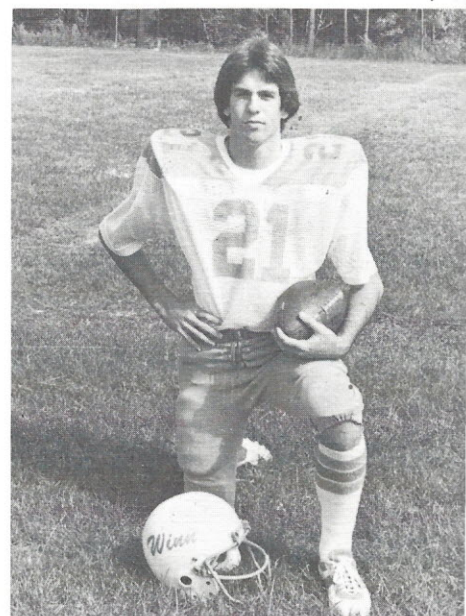
