













Board and Administration

For the first time, students had an opportunity to take chorus as an elective course. This class participated in the fall program, the Christmas program, a spring concert, and several out-of-town events.


The Chorus Club presented a program in the fall which spotlighted "music through the years." The group also provided music at the commencement exercises.










Boosters Give Biggest Boost Ever

Students Vie for Trip to Planet PTO












Eagles Soar to Victory
























Seniors Sponsor Homecoming
