

# Seventh Graders Go On Tour Of Washington, D.C.

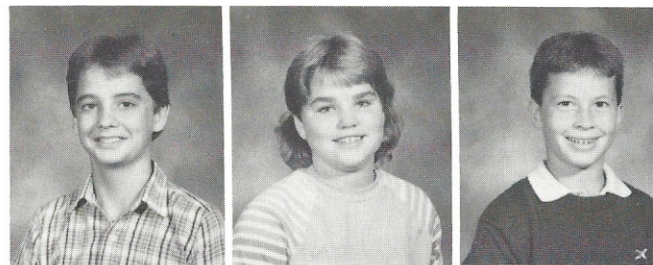

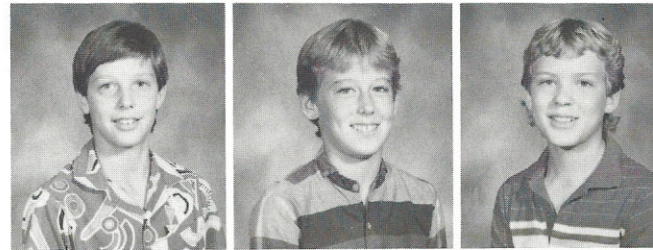
The trip proved to be very educational especially for the chaperones who learned to play "Truth or Dare."

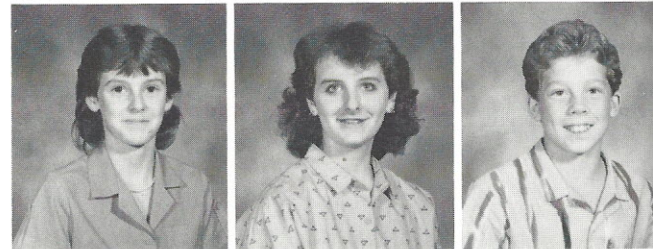
