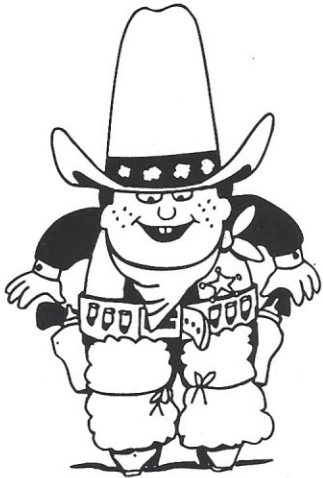

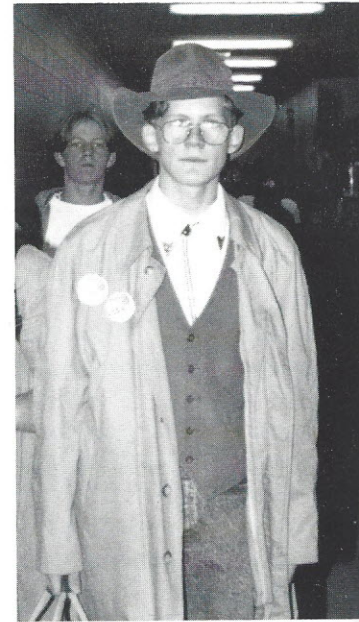
Western Day ...



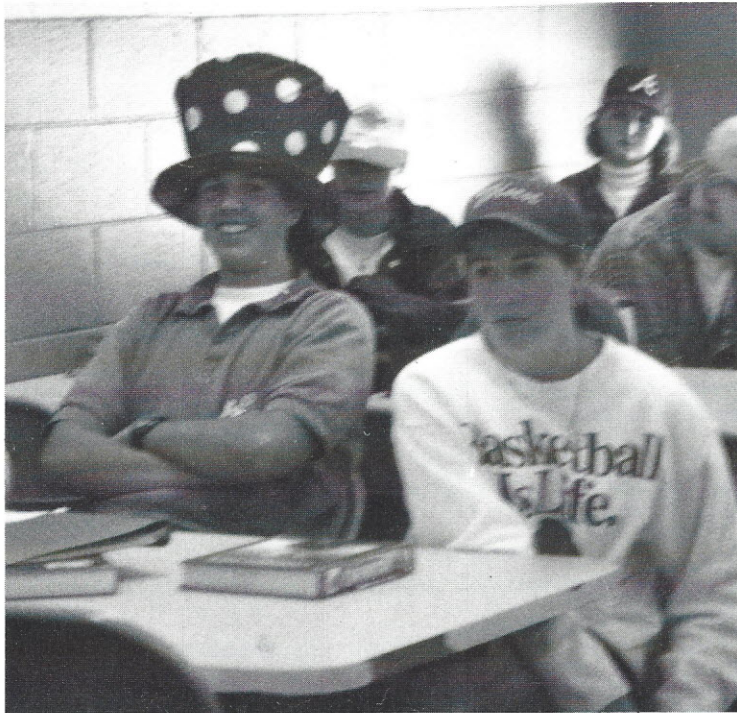
