

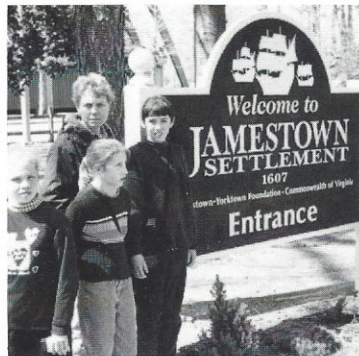
Sixth Graders Experience Historical Sites of VIRGINIA

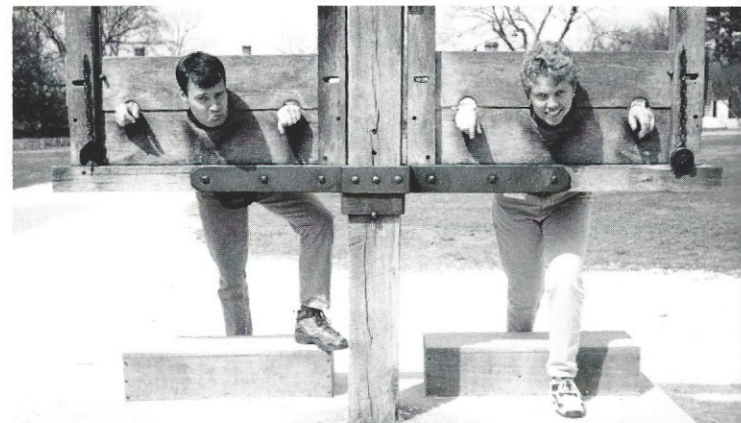
