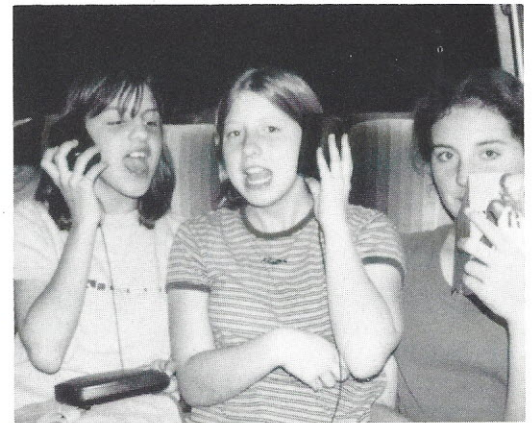


# VENTURING THROUGH VIRGINIA

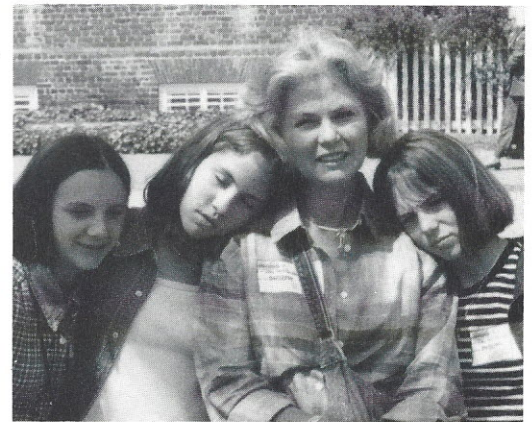
