

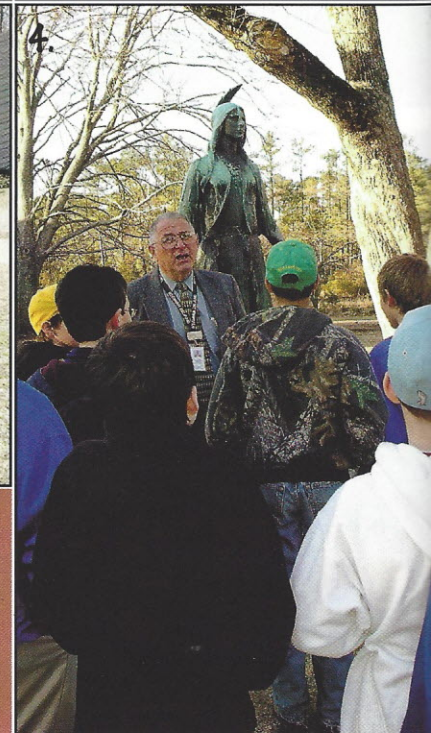
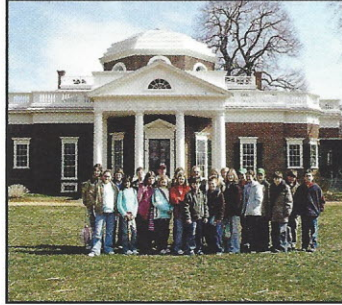
6th Grade Virginia Trip
