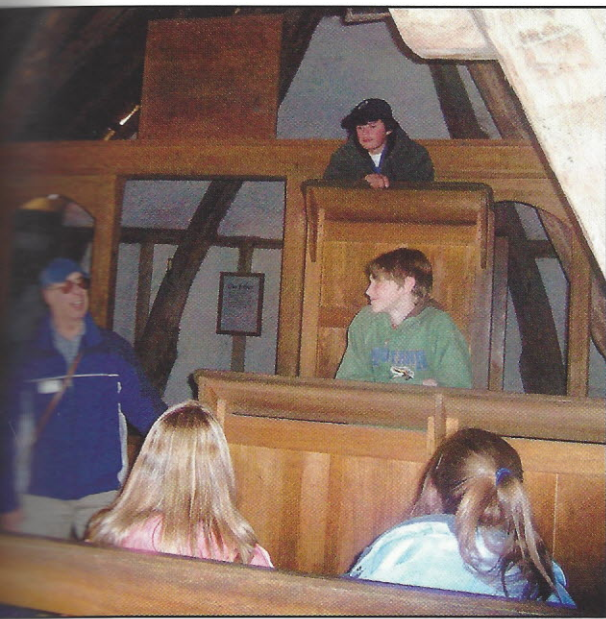
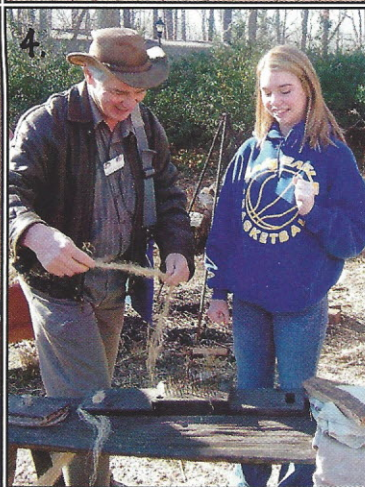
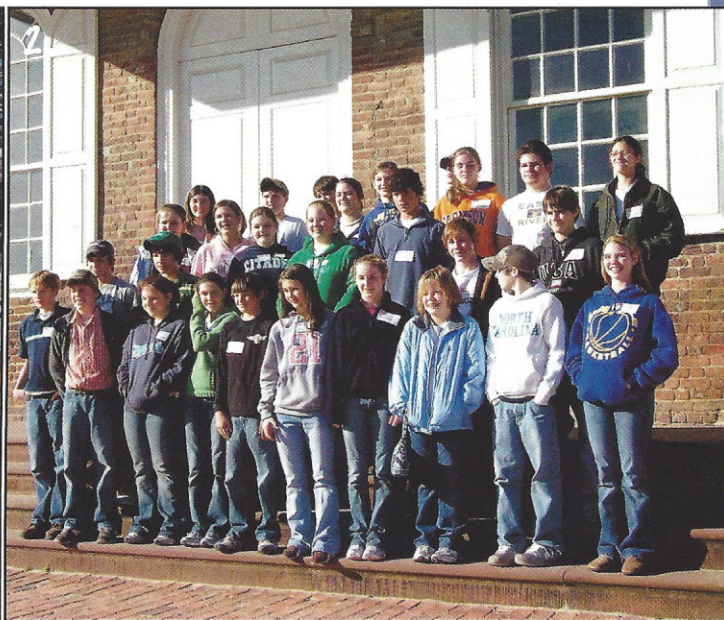
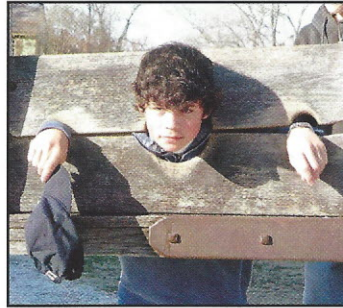


8th Grade Virginia Trip
