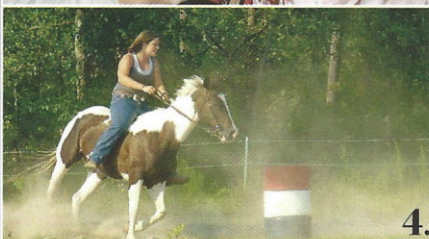


# When the Sun Goes Down...
