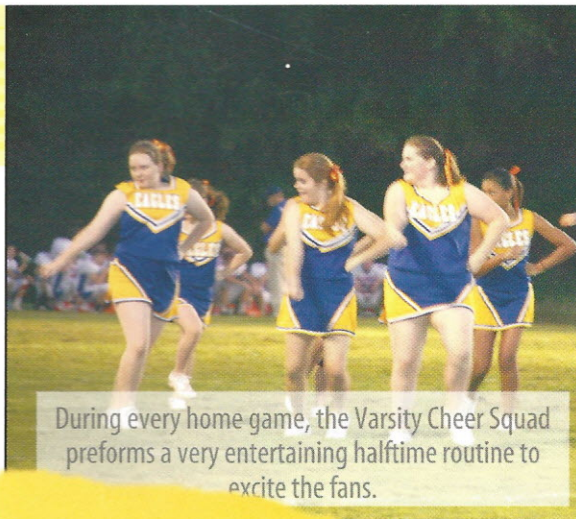
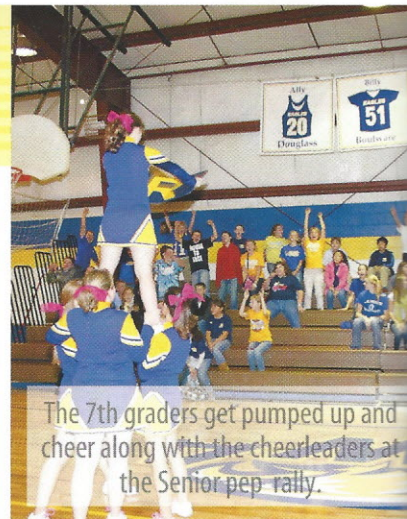

During every home game, the Varsity Cheer Squad performs a very entertaining halftime routine to excite the fans.



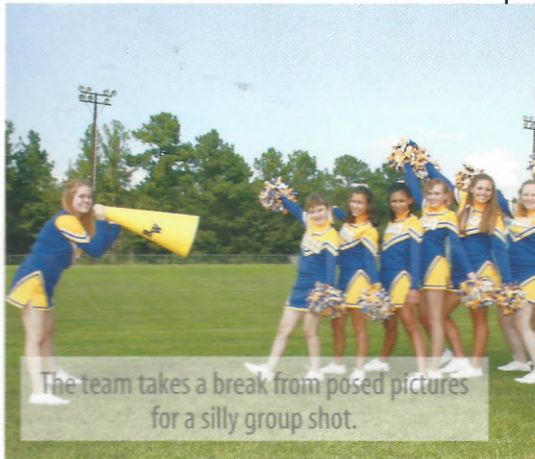
The 7th graders get pumped up and cheer along with the cheerleaders at the Senior pep rally.

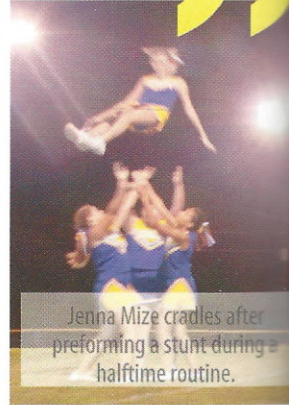

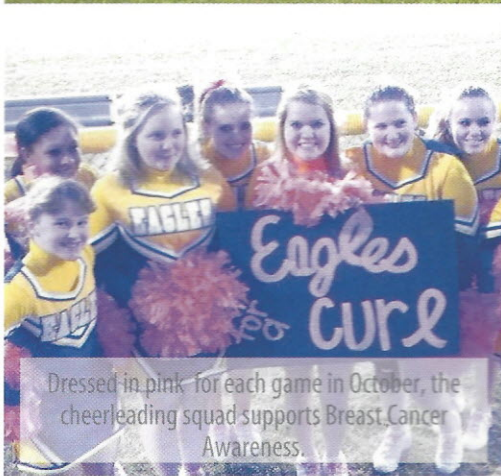
The team takes a break from posed pictures for a silly group shot.
