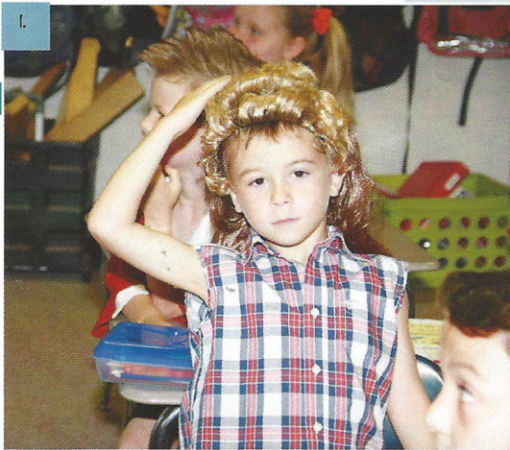


# Not afraid to *be* [outrageous]
