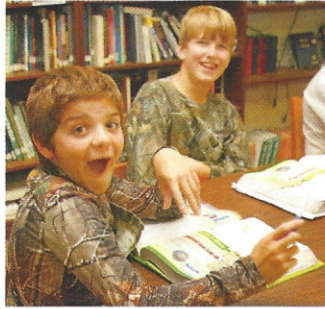


# HOMECOMING SPIRIT WEEK

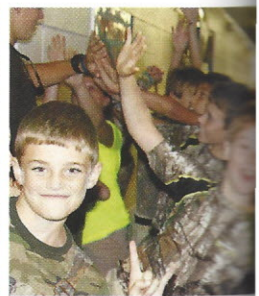
