GLORIA WHITE is living on a turkey farm with a long-time favorite friend who is now her husband.

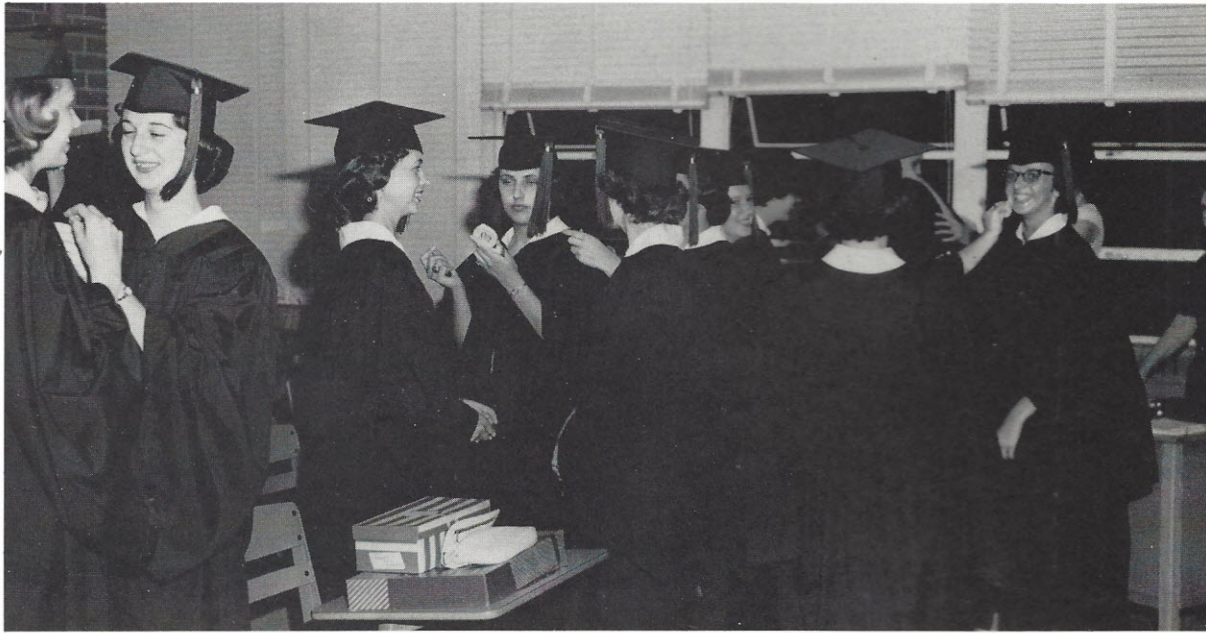
