

Fairfield County's Court House was built in 1823 by the noted architect Robert Mills and is perhaps one of the oldest court houses in the upper part of the state. It was constructed with English ballast brick brought to Charleston and then to Winnsboro. It was remodeled in 1939 but retained the Mill's design. Previously it had no piazzo or steps in front and wasn't overcast or plastered on the outside. The Court House serves a useful role in Fairfield County's judicial system as well as serving as a reminder of the past history of Winnsboro.
