



#### **MATH**





The teachers of the Science Department help the students in their search for the composition of life. This involves solving chemical equations, dissecting organisms, and doing biological research.














# LIBRARY AND STUDY HALL




#### **FRENCH**






Top left: Coach Catoe allows a student to test his book learning in a practical capacity.

Top right: The girls' gym class tries basketball for a change.



### CAREER EDUCATION











# 'CATS BATTLE FOR STATE TITLE





# GEORGE SMALL SETS NEW TRACK RECORD




# HOMECOMING PARADE
