The runners-up were Cynthia McGriff and Jessie Ashford, respectively. These two girls have much respect for W. H. S. and the students attending the school.



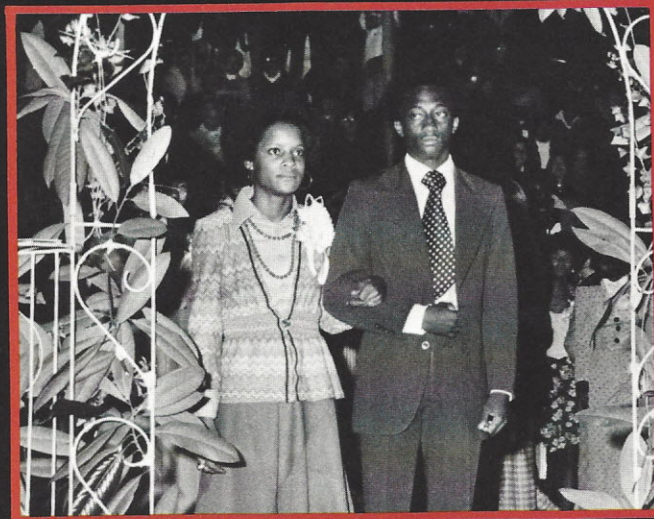
