It was most thoughtful of you to let me know that my letter addressed to the Klan had been received.

Now that the Reunion is over I'm sure every one enjoyed the "gettogether" to renew acquaintances. I'm wondering what information came to light on David and Rachel Killian--just who his parents were; if any one knew whether they had any children, etc. Will you please be so kind as to let me know? I shall appreciate it very much.

Since writing to the Klan I saw a copy of Daniel Whitener's will-probated in January 1833. In that he willed to "Rachel, wife of David Killian, the land or place on which they were then living" so I assume they were still living in that area in 1833 and didn't move to Georgia till after that time. If you were unable to get any information whatsoever do you have any suggestion at all as to where I might look for them? If I knew where, in Georgia, they went and the year of their going it would help greatly.

Thanks again for letting me know my letter had been received and I look forward to again having a few lines from you. Best wishes to you.
