

KILLIAN REUNION

It was also moved and carried that the officers of the association were a committee to collect funds preparatory for erecting the said monument.

A collection was taken for incidental expenses, which totalled \$7.26. The assembly was dismissed by Rev. Coons and then a picnic dinner was served on the grounds.
