One Fund-Eight Agencies

The month of June is the General Fund Agencies Season, and today is a special time set aside for the recognition of one of these agencies—Montreat.

Montreat is already familiar to most Presbyterians, as it is the summer conference grounds for all the Church Boards, and many Presbyterians have homes there. Today—Montreat Sunday—is a time when particular efforts and prayers are asked for our Church's activities in that picturesque area of the mountains of North Carolina.

The Assembly's Training School in Richmond, Virginia, prepares lay workers of the Church for fulltime service—in Christian education work, as pastors' assistants, Bible teachers, kindergarten workers, and home and overseas missionaries.

The Board of Women's Work, in Atlanta, guides the program of the Women of the Church, on the local, presbytery, synod, and Assembly levels.

The General Council, also in Atlanta, serves as a coordinating unit for certain areas of the Church's activities. It prepares the benevolence budget of the General Assembly, promotes stewardship; helps develop the Church's program

and calendar; and disseminates the news and publicity of the denomination.

The Church's only Negro college, Stillman, located at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, is a four-year, co-educational school which sends many Negroes into fulltime Christian service.

The American Bible Society is the agency through which the Church takes a part in distributing the Scripture throughout the world.

The Historical Foundation, located at Montreat, North Carolina, and pictured on the cover of today's bulletin, houses one of the world's greatest collections of literature and records of the Presbyterian and Reformed Churches.

Eighth, the agency added to the General Fund in 1957, is the *Presbyterian Foundation* which has offices in Charlotte, North Carolina. Dr. John R. Cunningham is the new head of this agency, the business of which is to supervise legacies and gifts given to the Church. It is the duty of the Foundation to invest its funds and to distribute the income earned to the various beneficiaries according to the provisions of the different wills and trusts.


One Fund Must Carry Them All
