Joy to the World-A Gift is Given

Joy to the world! the Lord is come; Let earth receive her King; Let ev'ry heart prepare Him room, And heav'n and nature sing!

Like a child with a new toy, a joyous earth received her King: God's great gift to His creation. But not all of earth's people have come, even yet, to share that joy. Heaven and nature sing, but too few hearts have prepared Him room.

Paul knew this joy, and it rings in his words:

"Thanks be to God for His unspeakable gift!" (II Cor. 9:15)

But many Christians, so-called, seem to have no idea how one should receive a gift from God. We are accustomed to the idea of giving and receiving gifts from our loved ones. We even try to out-do each other in expressing our love and thoughtfulness. But a gift from God? How does one receive such a gift? What does it mean? And what does one do about the embarrassing sense that for each gift received, a gift should be given in return?

Ah, there's the rub! Although there is no possible way of giving back any gift equal to that received from God, we hesitate to give that which we have: ourselves!

The words of the old carol, written by Isaac Watts 240 years ago, caught the deeper meaning, as well as the joy of God's gift. His words guide us toward the proper response to a gift from on high: receive the King, prepare Him room, and "let men their songs employ!"

Receive God's blessed Gift with open hearts, that He may rule them, and then give back the praise and love and joy that flow spontaneously from a heart in which He lives. "Repeat the sounding joy"—that all the world may know Him, who "rules the world with truth and grace." From this giving of one's self to God, this spontaneous witness to His gift, there inevitably follows that toward which all God's children are moving: "the nations prove the glories of His righteousness, and wonders of His love."

The deepest understanding of Christmas, of all the loving gifts poured out by friends and kin, and of the greatest Gift of all, comes when we have given that ultimate gift that is ours to give: ourselves in His service.
