"And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, and we beheld
"His glory, the glory of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace
and truth." John 1:14

The reality, the fact, of the Son of God coming to earth as a Babe is so stupendous that man's mind can scarcely grasp it. Even when dimly perceived through these words of John, the outlines of God's plan and the reality of His concern for His creation fill one with awe and leave the soul humble and thankful.

Because we scarcely can comprehend the immensity of these truths, we seek for ways of making them more understandable. Great paintings make vivid the events of the birth of Christ. Poets' singing words illumine the story. Simple symbols, beloved of Christians from earliest times, help us to grasp great truths. And music has captured some of the eternal melodies of the angel choir.

So it is that on the cover of this Christmas bulletin, once again we try to make visible and understandable some of the mystery of God's Gift. Using the ancient Christian symbols, culminating in the reality of the Holy Child at the heart of the Christmas Rose, the artist has put into flowing line and color the words of John.

The Hand of the Creator, symbolizing God the Father, gives this Gift to us. He is "the one who is, was, and shall be, the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end." (Rev. 22:13) The Hand holds the Promised One, the Chi Rho, symbol of Christ who is the Gift of God, the promised Messiah.

This Gift of God is symbolized by the Christmas Rose of the Incarnation, the coming in the flesh, which brought the mystical and spiritual into the realm of human reality. The Rose, used as a symbol since the First Century because of the roses which bloom at Christmas time in the Judean hills, manifests the unfolding of the Promise, as God made evident His love for man. That love took reality in the form of a tiny Baby born in a stable in Bethlehem; in a sky which was radiant with glory; in shepherds who, obeying some heavenly urging, came to kneel before the In' and in the manger; and in angels who, unable to contain their joy, shouted praise, to God:

With the Gift, has come the Holy Spirit, now transforming and renewing the lives of those who look to Christ as Lord and Saviour. The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit, symbolized by the seven doves, are described in Revelation 5:12 as Power, Riches, Wisdom, Strength, Honor, Glory and Blessing. These were the inheritance of the Christ, the Lamb Who was slain, and these are our inheritance through Him. These are the meanings of that which you see—that we may more fully comprehend God's entrance into history, the central fact in man's pilgrimage.
