



Baptist Church, built 1836. The wing of the church is partly visible at left, was added on west side in the 1920's. Kennedy Hall (built in 1950's), a concrete block building used for Sunday School, is partly visible in the background at left. The church & classrooms wing were veneered with granite in 1944. This photo was taken by me (James W. Green, III, Rt.5, Box 720 Winnsboro, SC 29180-9516 (803)635-9236) 1 June 1976. Removal of the granite veneer was started on the west side a few days before this photo was taken. When the granite was removed & the porch on the east side (shown) was truncated, the church was moved off its basement (shown) to a site about 100 yards south west, where it still stands. The basement of the old church was filled in & a new building constructed thereon in 1976. This photo was taken on out-of-date Kodak Plus-X pan, ASA 125, 20 exp. 35 mm film which was supposed to be developed before Sep.75, but was developed between June 1 & 7, 1976, when this 3.5x5" print was made. The 1976 building & this 1836 building are on Road 420 at SC 269.
