

Lebanon (Jackson Creek) Presbyterian Church Cemetery



This cemetery is located at the site of the Lebanon (Jackson Creek) Presbyterian Church, about six miles west of Winnsboro on State Road 38. When the Church became unsafe, the church was moved about two miles northwest to the site of the present Lebanon Presbyterian Church.

There are several graves that are in a survey taken in 1991 that were not found. These are:

Elizabeth Brice – died 1848, infant daughter of John G. & Jeanette Brice

Mary Brice – died 8/15/1855, daughter of John & Mary Brice

James Turner Martin – died 9/19/1817 at age of 20 years

Mary Milling – died 1/29/1839 at the age of 3 years

Robinson – Broken stone on ground

Eleanor Robinson – stone broken – illegible

William Robinson – died ?/15/1835, husband of Martha

The grave locations start at the right as you enter the gate. Gaps in the numbers indicate vacant spaces or graves marked with only fieldstones.



Monument to Lieutenant James Clark

This monument is on the left side of the old church. The inscription has been broken but said:

To The Memory of
Lieutenant James Clark
of Company G. Palmetto Regiment
South Carolina Volunteers In Mexico
He was born October 1st 1815
In 1836 He Served As A Volunteer in Florida
And in 1847 in Mexico
In the Memorable Battle of Cherubusco
On the 20th of August 1847
As Commander of his Company
And while leading it on to Victory he received
A shot in the Forehead and fell exclaiming
“Onward Men, Onward
Remember where you came from”
Thus ended the brief though Brilliant career of One
Of Fairfield’s Bravest Sons
