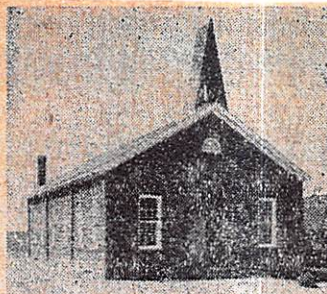
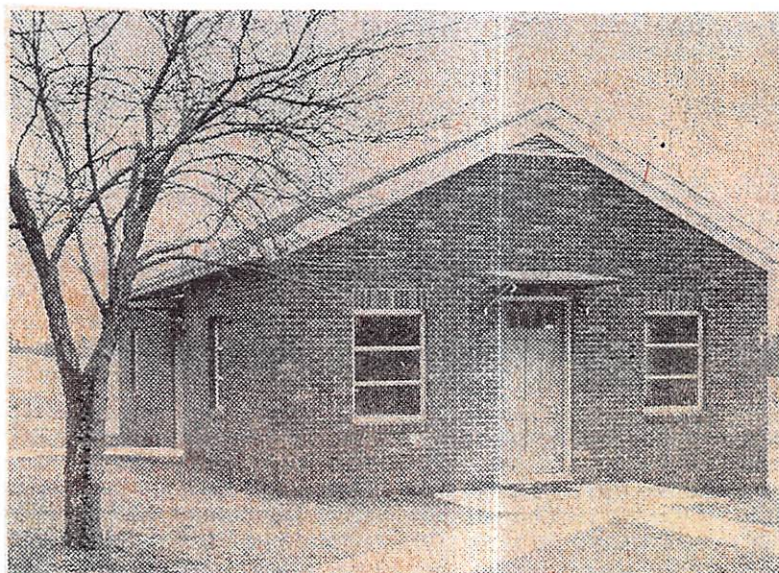
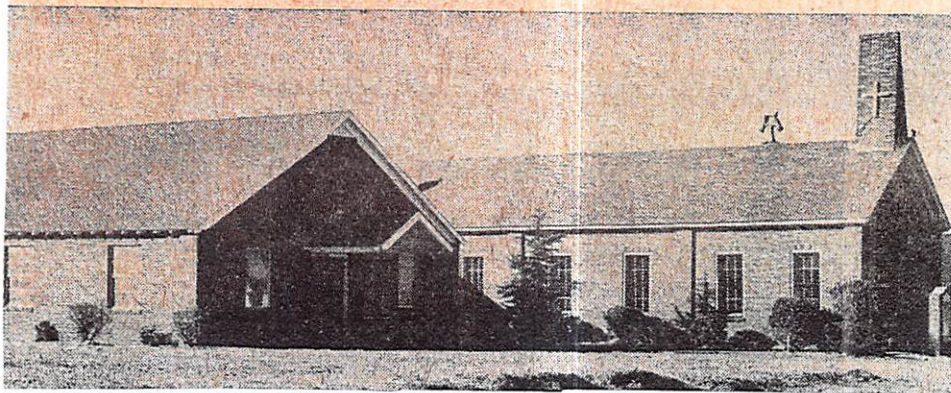


Nazarene Church

Sunday morning, May 10, marked another milestone for the pastor and members of the Church of the Nazarene as they gathered to dedicate their new Sunday School annex. The building, constructed of cement blocks and brick veneer, houses a 20x27 foot assembly room and two additional classrooms, 10x15 feet each, and is valued at approximately \$7,000.00. It is com-

plete with air-conditioning and gas heat.

The dedication service was conducted by Rev. Ben F. Marlin, South Carolina District Superintendent of the Church of the Nazarene. Special music and singing was rendered by George Houston of Raleigh, N. C.

A very beautiful and touching part of the service came when the

building was memorialized as follows: "We the people of this church and congregation in reverence and precious memory proclaim and establish that this building from now and henceforth shall stand as a memorial to Annie Mae Gunter, whose memory we cherish and whose life and faithful service we hold in honor now and ever."

The building is to be used for the Young People's Department in Sunday School, Nazarene Young People's Society on Sunday afternoons and for mid-week prayer service.

Special recognition was extended to the building committee, composed of the pastor, Rev. E. N. Gunter, Oscar Pullen and Ray McKenzie.
