In the interest of economy, both sides of the paper were used and single-spaced form was adopted for all work on Statewide Historical Project. This, and the effort to convey some idea of the original manuscript from which copy was made, nucessitated a definite and uniform style. Each copyist was, therefore, instructed to observe the following:

- 1. Spelling, punctuation, capitalization, and construction to be exactly as in original, whether correct or incorrect; the author to have benefit of doubt, however, if difficult to determine whether a capital or small letter, an e or an i, etc., was intended; special effort to be made to copy spelling of names of persons and places with exactitude;
- 2. The old style s (f) to be represented always by s -- never by f;
- 3. Small, elevated letters in abbreviations to be indicated by the period between initial letters and elevated. Ex.: M. (M.r), Jan. (Jan.y), etc.;
- 4. Distinction between capital I and J (alike in early MS) to be determined by rest of letters in the name;
- 5. The symbol per (%) to be drawn, or P substituted; English pound (£) 1;
- 6. Words too illegible to be read to be drawn, and followed by /illegible/:
- 7. Words or notes on margin to be typed on margin, or between brackets after paragraph or page to which related: [Marginal note (or word): "(exact words of)";
- 8. Words interlined by author to be placed between bars: /interlined words/;
- 9. Words struck out in original MS to be typed, but also struck out by a series of hyphen strokes: These-werds-were-struck-eut-in-eriginal-MS;
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- 11. Ornamental markings of author to be drawn or omitted altogether;
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- 13. Words, lines, or parts of book missing in MS to be explained between brackets: Ex.: /MS torn/; /Half of page torn from MS/; /Page blank in MS/, etc.;
- 14. Page numbers of MS to be shown in outside margin of typed copy; typed page numbers to be placed consecutively at top of typed pages;
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- 16. ALL TYPED COPY TO BE CHECKED CAREFULLY WITH ORIGINAL MS FOR EXACTITUDE.

## INTRODUCTION.

The manuscript records of counties, cities, churches and similar organizations are recognized as the most valuable sources for students of social and economic history. Despite their value these records have usually been more inaccessibly and carelessly stored than almost any other class of material. The reasons are obvious: public offices are subject to ever increasing pressure from the anounulation of papers; the county records are often far from the centers where students can conveniently work; the records of churches and other organizations are usually scattered, and in the keeping of individuals who have no fireproof facilities in their homes.

Various efforts have, from time to time, been made to meet this situation. For years the University Library made copies of valuable manuscripts whenever it was practicable. In 1934 the Daughters of the American Revolution sponsored a CWA and ERA statewide project through which copies of South Carolina wills were placed in the University Library and in Continental Hall, Washington, D. C.

In 1935 the Caroliniana Committee of the University of South Carolina proposed to the state officials of the WPA a much more comprehensive plan for preservation of records and for making them readily accessible to students. On October 1, 1935 the Statewide Historical Project, sponsored by the University, with Dr. Anne King Gregorie, supervisor, and fifty copyists, was authorized to make copies of the older and more valuable records; and, in addition, to compile a comprehensive list of state and local records. The task of preliminary planning and organization was done by Miss Gregorie. On March 1, 1936 the Historical Records Survey, a federal project, undertook the task of listing public records on a national scale, and Miss Gregorie was given charge of the work in South Carolina. Seven months later the Survey was housed by the University, and was thereafter carried on in close cooperation with the Statewide Historical Project supervised by Miss Gregorie's successor, Miss Flora Belle Surles.

The work of these two projects, thanks primarily to the indefatigable and resourceful supervisors, constitutes an outstanding achievement. The copyists, without preliminary training to fit them for the task, have with great patience and, in many cases, with fine devotion and real skill, deciphered the dim and crabbed writing of crumbling pages that otherwise would be a permanent loss. These projects have been under the administrative direction of Mrs. Margaret D. Davies, State Director of Women's and Professional Projects; without her appreciation of the value of the work and her capable support the results would have fallen far short of the actual achievement. The University has also been fortunate in obtaining copies made by local projects in Charleston, through agreements with the College of Charleston and with Mr. E. P. Grice, Jr., of the WPA; and local projects in Chester and in Edgefield have contributed some copies.

The thanks of all persons interested in the history of our state are due to these officials and workers, to the public officers who at great inconvenience to themselves have given working space and aid, and to custodians of other records who have been equally generous with their time and help.

In the proceedings of the Union Meeting of the Union Association, Friday, April 27.th, 1860, we have noticed a query introduced by Bro. F. A Martin to this effect: "Is it right for a Minority to withdraw from a church under any circumstances?" We are further informed that the query after discussion, was answered affirmatively.

That there may be circumstances justifying such withdrawel, we hesitate not to admit. As for example, should a majority so far depart from first principles upon which the church
came together as to render it altogether a different thing, or
body, from which it was originally, then a minority, however
small it may be, in our judgment, has a right, and in duty,
ought to withdraw from the erratic. For instance, should a
majority turn Campbellites, or Universalists, or Pedobaptists,
then those holding to first principles should withdraw, in order to maintain the truth, and they should "contend earnestly,
for the faith once delivered to the saints."

Again, should a majority become so loose in morals as to render it utterly impossible to maintain wholesome discipline, insometh that the church becomes a by-word and a reproach to all right thinking men-turning the church into a drunken possee, or a dancing rabble, or some other detestable thing, we would say that the minority one it to themselves, and to the cause they profess to love, to leave such majorities to glory in their shame, not however, till every reasonable effort is

made to reclaim such errorists.

But the question which the querist perhaps designed to cover, is yet unanswered, viz: Is it right for an individual member, charged with heterodoxy, or immorality, to withdraw at pleasure, charging the church with informality, or oppression, or any other pretence whatever? This, no doubt, was the design of the querist, and had it been thus expressed, would the answer have been as above stated? - We presume not; for such license, it seems to us, would open the flood gates of discorder and confusion, and would tend to evil, and only evil, and that continually. Where is the man, if such a course be allowed, that would stand his trial in church, and be disgraced by a vote of exclusion? We think there are very few who act so to being down the censure of the church upon them, would ever come to trial, but would avail themselves of this liberty; and denounce the church as wrong and exceedingly oppressive.

will so far depart from correct church discipline as to approve, or even wink at such a course - Our Savior did not so act when falsely accused, although he well knew that not only his character, but his life was to be the consequence; and though he could have called twelve legions of angels to his rescue, still the patiently bore the scoffs and scourges of his bitterest enemies, without a murmur or word of reproach, and even prayed for his murderers, - And He said, "If any man will be my disciple, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me."

Dip /sic / the Apostles and martyrs thus act? Some may reply, and say that they were arraigned before the civil powers.
Be it so, are any of us likely to be worse treated by our brethren than they were by the civil powers? The only instance of
appeal even, was made by Paul to Caesar, and that by special

inspiration of a God.

Do you ask, what then should be the course a brother should then he is about being tried by his church, and he has a consciousness of his innocence, and is fully persuaded that the church is determined before hand, (or a sufficient number of them, at least, ) to exclude him, right or wrong, guilty or innocent, we would say to such a brother, defend yourself as best you can, (not with carnal, but spiritual weapons,) and if after all, you are excluded, it is your privilege to lay your case before a sister church. And here comes in church Independence: The church this appealed to has the right to examine into the cade, and if satisfield of his innocence, she has a right, according to our view, to receive him into her fellowship - not to force the church that excluded him to take him back as a member. In so doing, however, the church thus restoring or receiving him, runs the risk of incurring the displeasure of her sister church, and we would not advise a church to this course without the clearest evidence of the innocence of the accused.

Again: should a minority be thus expelled, they may seek redress as the individual above described. Or, if they prefer it, they may organize themselves into an independent church. In such a case, however, we would recommend such minority to seek the advice of sister churches; remembering that "In the midst of counsel-

lors there is safety."

We are no great advocate for Councils or Countitees, still, in some cases, we think them admissable, and even necessary; for churches, as well as individuals, are fallible, and liable at times to suffer their prejudices to warp their judgment. Hence, a Council or Committee of brethren are less liable to err in this respect, and may be better able to do justice to the oppressed party

than the party accusing are.

And in all such cases, we would say to the party or parties calling such Council, you should give the matter of difficulty up entirely into the hands of the Council called, for it is presumed that the parties concerned have done all in their power to settle the difficulty smong themselves, and have Tailed. Will any say this is taking the power out of the hands of the church, where it belonged? Granted - but has not the church acknowledged her incompensately to settle the matter, by calling such helps? We would not not not on such a committee were we called on, if the decision was not to be final. If, in the judgment, however, of the parties, the committee are incompetent from any cause whatever, to do justice, they may object to their setting on the case; but if submitted, the decision should be final.

Thus we have given full expression to our views, and the reader may have them for just what they are worth; and if the churches would observe strictly these principles, much difficulty and church

grangling might be avoided. " /End of printed article pasted on page.
