24b. ADDISON, ALLEN B. Lieutenant in war of 1812, stationed in Charleston. Married Patience Youngblood Butler, widow of Standmore Butler and granddaughter of Judge Arthur Simkins, one of the founders of Edgefield. He was one of the early court officers of Edgefield. Patience Addison, daughter of George Youngblood and Nancy Simkins, was great-grandmother of Judge Milledge L. Bonham.
