He served under Capt. R. William Alexander,

Thomas and Col. Hammond and was in the
siege of Augusta. Later, he joined Capt. Amos
Davis and Col. Hopkins. During 1782, he was

He served sixty days under Capt. Robert
Thomson and Gen. Sumter, lost a horse at
Briar Creek and was dead at the close of the
