ALSOP - ALSUP

Wm. Alsup or Alsop lived in N. W. Fairfield among the Hill and Mobley families. He witnessed the Will of Wm. Hill, signed July 1, 1790, and signed as a bondsman for the executor of the estate, William Hill, Jr. Already shown, "Elizabeth Hill md. John Alsup." She was the dau. of Wm. Hill, Jr. Wm. Alsup witnessed a deed in 1792, Wm. Hill to Samuel Moberly - Also another deed, Wm. Mobley to Wm. Hill in the same year.... And "Wm. Hill bounds unto Mobley...50 acres of land." (1788)

The 1790 census of Fairfield County, S. C. shows:

"Wm. Alsup - 2 males over 16 years 5 males under 16 years
 3 females

The Alsups may have had other connections with the Hills but the relation is not apparent. They must have moved west to Georgia, Alabama or Mississippi. Robert, Joseph and Drury Alsup settled in Giles County, Tenn. A Drury Alsup patented land in Lowndes Co., Miss. Donie Alsup lived in Monroe Co., Miss. Lowndes County was later cut from Monroe.

Fairfield District, South Carolina

The 1790 Census, Fairfield District, S. C.:
William Hill - "1 male over 16 years". (living alone)

He died in 1790. FAIRFIELD COUNTY WILLS--- "Will of William Hill, signed July 1, 1790, Proved August, 1790. "I give all I possess to my son William Hill, Jr., and make him executor...I revoke my other Will in which I divided my estate among my heirs for now I desire my son William Hill Jr. to have it all."
/signed/ William Hill, Sr.

"Bond for 500 pounds - for late William Hill, planter deceased - letters of administration granted to Wm. Hill Junior."
