

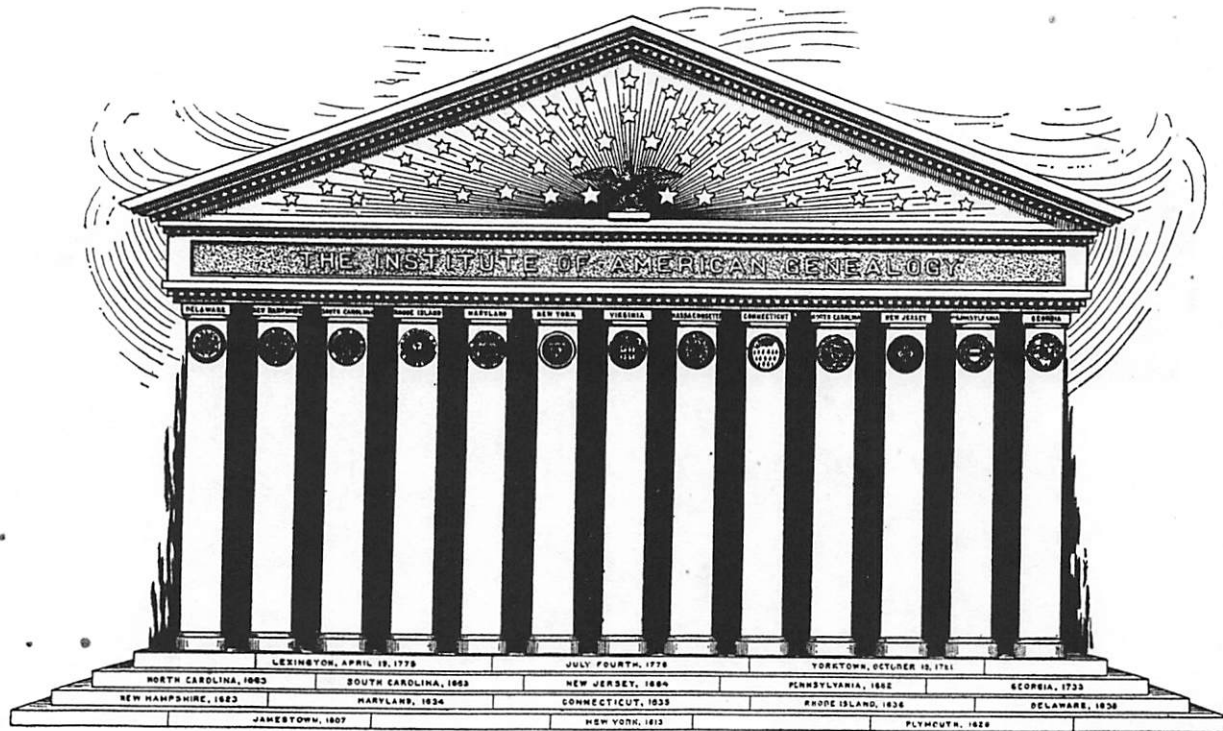

ALLINSON (see also Allenson): 1—Personal. 2—Son of Allin or Allen (qv); (see E384-E420).

ALLIOT, see Allet, and Elliott.

ALLIS, ALLISS (see also Alice, Alis): 1—Personal. 2—(a) Son of Allie or Alley; (b) the same as Alice (qv), the pet form of Adalaid; (c) sometimes confused with **ELLIS** (qv). 5—1086, William Alis held Ellstone, county Hants (now Allington, Hampshire), as tenant in chief of the King (Domesday Book); 1098, Geoffrey Alis, crusader to the Holy Land; 1273, Gocelinus fl. Alice, county Lincoln (Hundred Rolls); 1273, Richard fl. Alise, county Salop (Hundred Rolls); 1571, Agnes Alles and George Haynes, marriage license (London, i, p. 50); (see A288-E376-E420).

ALLISTONE, see Alstone.

ALLKIN, ALKIN, ALCHIN, ALLCHIN (see also Alken): 1—Personal. 3—Double diminutive of Allen (qv), and Alexander (qv); English diminutive suffix -kin; Bardsley says, "Lower suggests that it (Alkin) stands for Halkin, the diminutive of Henry; this view is defeated by the fact that Alkin has always been without the aspirate, and has always run side by side with its close relation Alcock (qv); let it not be forgotten that Allen, as one of the favourite personal names of the 13th and 14th centuries, must have had its popular nickname and pet forms; I have included Alchin and Alchin as variants of Allkin, but see Allcorn"; Barber gives, "Allkin; from Alken, a local name of Belgium or Halkyn in North Wales." 5—1306, John Alkyn (Writs of Parliament); 1617, Thomas Alkin and Mary Newman, marriage license (London ii, p. 53); (see E374-E376-E420).

ALLKINS: 1—Personal. 2—Son of Allkin (qv). 3—Ferguson (E582) suggests that Allkins and Elkin may possibly mean Englishman (see E376-E382-E384-E420).

ALLMAN, ALLIMAN, ALLMOND, ALMAN, ALMOND: 1—Local, belonging to Germany. 2—All man. 3—From the German tribe who called themselves "All-men"; Anglo-French, Almain(e), Almen, Almaine; Old French, Alemagne; French, Allemagne; Latin, Alemannia; Old High German, Alman, al, all, and man (singular and plural); compare Almond. 5—1273, Custance de Alemanian (Hundred Rolls); 1202-1338 William Alemannus (Patent Rolls); 1358, Hanekin Almond, John de Almann, varlets of Countess of Surrey (Household book of Queen Isabella); (see E374-E376-E382-E384-E390-E398-E410-E420).

ALLMARK, see Almaric and Hallmark.

ALLNATT, ALLNOTT, ALLNUTT: 1—Personal. 2—Elf-boldness. 3—English; from the common Anglo-Saxon personal name Ael(f)noth, aelf, elf, and noth, boldness; Harrison says, "The son of Alnot or Alnoth, the Anglo-Saxon, Alnod." 5—1272-1307, "The Earl Warren had also two carucates of land, which Almod, a freeman, possessed in King Edward's reign" (Blomefield and Parkin, History of Norfolk, viii, p. 54); 1272-1307, Earlham's Manor in Surlingham, belonged to Godric the sewer, and Alnot the Saxon (Blomefield and Parkin, History of Norfolk, v, p. 469); (see E374-E376-E398-E420).

ALLOM, see Allam, Alum, Hallam.

ALLOMBY, ALLENBY (qv): 1—Local, of that place in Cumberland (see E374).

ALLOTT, ALLETT (qv), **ALLOT**: 1—Personal. 3—A form of Elliott (qv), or Elyot, the diminutive of Elias; Lower thinks Allott is probably the same as Hallett; Barber gives, "Norse, Hallathr; Swedish, Allart; Danish, Allert; Dutch, Allot; Flemish, Allard, Allart,

Hallart; Norman-French, Hallet." 5—1273, Phillip Allote, county Huntingdon (Hundred Rolls); 1379, Adam Alot, Yorks. (Poll Tax, p. 204); 1568, Richard Allett, (Register, University of Oxford, i, p. 273); (see E374-E376-E384-E398).

ALLOWAY (see also Alloway): 1—Local, of Alloway, county of Ayr, Scotland. 2—Perhaps "the wild field." 3—Gaelic, alla, wild, and the aspirated form mhagh, mh being the same as v or w of magh, a field, plain; also a variant of Alloway (qv); (see E374-E376-E418-E420).

ALLOWS, ALOES: 1—Local. 2—Hallow or moors. 3—Celtic (see E413a).

ALLPENNY, see Halfpenny.

ALLPORT, see Alport.

ALLPRESS: 1—Personal. 2—Holy Priest. 3—Anglo-Saxon, halig, holy, from hal, whole; thus -prest (priest) and not -press is the suffix; the surname has always had Cambridge and Hants for its habitat; there need be no anxiety as to the want of an h if Holy Priest be the parent, as the Hundred Rolls (1273) in scores of cases ignore the aspirate. 5—1273, Thomas Alpriet, county Cambridge (Hundred Rolls); (see E374-E376).

ALLSHORN: 1—Local (see E374).

ALLSOP, ALLSEP, ALLSOPP, ALLSUP, ALSOP: 1—Local, of Alsop-en-le-dale, a chapelry in the parish of Ashbourne, Derbyshire. 2—Aelle's hope or valley or hollow. 3—English, the Domesday Elleshope; see Hope; this ancient family were seated at Alsop-in-the-dale, about the time of the Conquest, and there continued in an uninterrupted descent for 19 or 20 generations. 5—1273, William Alsape, county Cambridge (Hundred Rolls); 1273, Elena Alsope, county Cambridge (Hundred Rolls); 1538, Thomas Alsop, gentleman Potycary to Henry VIII (Privy Purse expenses, Princess Mary, p. 73 and note); (see E374-E376-E386-E398-E420).

ALLT: 1—Personal. 2—Old. 3—Anglo-Saxon, ald, old (see E382).

ALLTREW (see also Aلتree): 1—Local. 2—Old tree. 3—Anglo-Saxon, ald, old, and treow, tree (see E398).

ALLEVEY, ALVEY (qv), **ALLVY, ALLAWAY** (qv), **ALWAY, ELVEY**: 1—Personal. 2—Elf-war. 3—English; Harrison says "descendants of the Anglo-Saxon personal name, Aelfwig; Old English, aelf, elf, and wig, war"; also see Alloway; Bardsley says, "The son of Aldwy"; Ferguson (E418) refers to Alloway. 5—1273, Robert Alewi, county Oxford (Hundred Rolls); 1273, Walter Elwy, county Oxford (Hundred Rolls); 1544, Ralph Alway and Mary Bylby, marriage license (Faculty Office, p. 3); (see E376-E418-E420).

ALLWARD: 1—(a) Official; (b) personal. 2—(a) Hill warden of watchman; (b) elf warden. 3—(a) Norse, Hallvarthr; (b) Anglo-Saxon Aelfweard, Alward. See also Aylward (see E374-E418-E420).

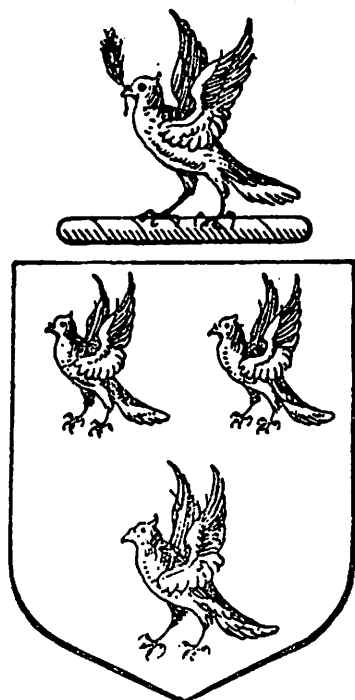
ALLWATER: 1—Local. 2—From some local name compounded of "water" (see E396).

ALLWAY, see Alloway, Allvey.

ALLWIN, see Alwin.

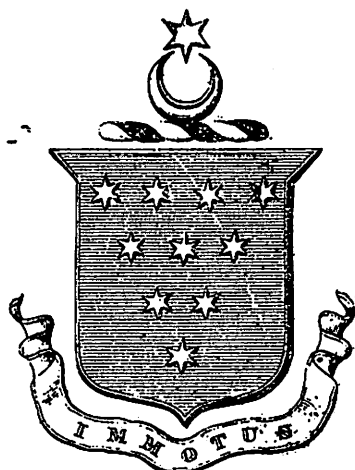
ALLWOOD: 1—Local. 2—Dweller at the old wood. 3—Old English, (e)ald, old and wudu, wood; Barber refers to Allward (qv); hill warden or watchman. Ferguson (E418) gives, Anglo-Saxon, all, great or illustrious, and wid, wood; Old German, aluid (see E374-E418-E420).

ALLWORK: 1—Local, belonging to Aldwark, a hamlet in county Derby. 2—The old work or fortification. 3—English; Old English, (e)ald, old, and w(e)orc, work; Lower also holds this to be a corruption of Aldwark (see E374-E380-E398-E420).



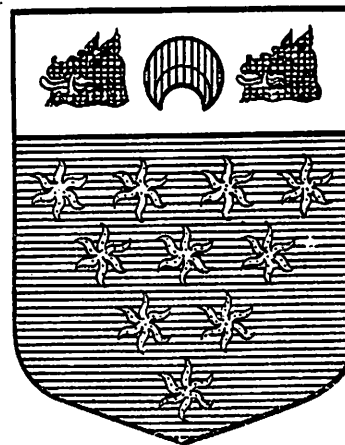
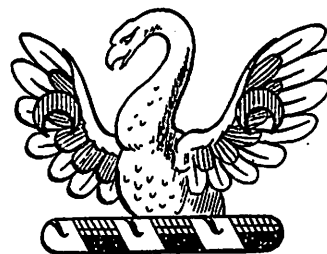

Joseph Alsop, from England to New Haven.
 Arms: Sable, three doves volant argent, legged and beaked gules.
 Crest: A dove volant holding in the beak an ear of wheat. (See A496-A499a-A502).



ALSTON

John Alston, from England to North Carolina.
 Arms: Azure, ten estoiles of six points, four, three, two, one, or.
 Crest: A crescent argent, charged with an estoile or.
 Motto: Immotus.
 (See A36-A306-A496).



ALSTON

Arms: Azure, ten estoiles or; on a chief argent a crescent inverted gules, between two boars' heads coupé sable.
 Crest: A demi-swan wings expanded with a crescent reversed gules, on each.
 Motto: In altum. (See A496).



ALWARD

Arms: Azure, a fleur-de-lis between two stars of eight points in bend, and two increscents in bend sinister or.
 Crest: Out of a ducal coronet a vested and embowed dexter arm holding an anchor and cable.
 Motto: Verus et fidelis semper. (See A496).

and settled at Lynn (Saugus); one of the founders of Sandwich, 1637; sold his lands there and removed to Portsmouth, R.I., land grant, 1644; freeman, 1655, later juryman and commr.; m. at Lutterworth, Eng., abt. 1626, Audrey Barlowe (1603-living 1676); issue: 1-Anna, or Annis (bap. S. Kilworth, Feb. 26, 1626/27-d. R.I., May 6, 1709), m. abt 1648, John Greene, dep. gov. R.I. and Providence Plantations, 11 children; 2-Christopher (b. abt. 1631-d. Jan. 30, 1712/13), deputy to R.I. gen. assembly, 1689-90; later removed to Monmouth co., N.J.; m. July 9, 1661, Elizabeth (d. after 1708), dau. of Thomas Cornell, m. Rebecca —, 3 children; 3-John (d.s.p. Oct. 1, 1676); capt. in Philip's War, m. Mary, dau. of James Cole, m. Mary — (she m. 2d, 1677, John Pococke); 4-Job (d. 1684), bought land in Monmouth co., N.J., 1667; m. Mary, dau. of Christopher Unthank of Warwick, R.I., m. Susanna — (she m. 2d, Thomas Townsend), 11 children; 5-Catherine, m. Bartholomew (d. before 1703), s. of Matthew West, 4 children (A298-G164-N136-N157d).

ALNUTT, see also **Allnutt**.

ALNUTT, Thomas, and wife, living at "Ye Neck of Land," Va., Feb. 16, 1623; according to muster roll of 1624, he came in the "Gifte," and his wife in the "Marygold" (H1249).

ALPATT, Ann, brought from Eng. to Va., 1636, by John Neale, Accomac co. (V251).

ALPOCK, see also **Ahlbach**.

ALPOCK (Ahlbach or Albach), **Morris** (d. German Valley-now Long Valley, N.J., 1769); according to family tradition, 3 bros. came from Holland to Pa., abt. 1732 (Pa. Archives, II, 17, gives date as 1734-see Ahlbach); Morris is found as landowner in German Valley, with wife and 3 children named in will, probated 1769; had issue: 1-John William (b. 1736/37-d. June 13, 1811), m. Elisabeth Sharp (b. 1741-d. Dec. 19, 1817), 7 children, many descendants; 2-Philip is thought to have m. Elsa Catherine, dau. of Matthias Cramer, but she was b. 1779; 3-Elizabeth. No relationship is known to exist between the Alpoeks of Cokesbury and High Bridge (both of which qv), and this family (N153-P498).

ALPOCKS of Cokesbury, N.J.: John Alpoek (b. 1739-d. Apr. 1, 1821), came from Germany to the Delaware river, and early settled in Hunterdon co., N.J.; m. Elizabeth —, (d. before 1776); m. 2d, — (wife's name not of record; issue (by 1st marriage): 1-John Wilhelm (b. Dec. 28, 1768), m. Catherine, dau. of Herbert Apgar, 7 children; 2-Mary (d. unm.); 3-Sophia (b. May 30, 1771), m. William, s. of William Alpoek of High Bridge, N.J., 6 children; issue (by 2d marriage): 4-George (b. Jan. 28, 1777), m. Mary, dau. of Aaron Sutton, 6 children; 5-Eva (b. Feb. 21, 1779); 6-Peter (b. Feb. 12, 1781), m. Annie, dau. of Peter Apgar, 5 children (N153).

ALPOCKS of High Bridge, N.J.: Three bros., John William, George and Peter Alpoek, came to N.J. prob. with parents; 1-John William (b. 1732-d. Apr. 13, 1817), occupied or bought 184 acres in High Bridge tp., N.J., 1802; m. Anna Elck (d. abt. 1777), 3 children; m. 2d, Elise May Henry, 2 children; 2-George, "settled on road from Bray's Hill to Cokesbury"; m. Anna Maria —; had at least one child, Eva (b. Feb. 3, 1770); 3-Peter, settled in Alexandria tp., Hunterdon co., N.J.; m. Anna —, 6 children (N153).

ALPORT, Sara (b. 1610), embarked at port of London, Eng., July 24, 1635, to be transported to Va. in the "Assurance" (H1249).

ALPORTE, Jon., brought from Eng. to Va., 1635, by Capt. Adam Thoroughgood (V251).

ALPOTT, Jones, brought from Eng. to Va., 1656, by Sir Henry Chichley (V251).

ALRICKS, **Hermannus** (b. Phila., Pa.-d. Carlisle, Pa., Dec. 14, 1772), g.s. of Peter Alricks (qv); mem. Pa. gen. assembly, prothonotary of Cumberland co., Justice, commd. by John Penn to swear in other justices; m. Sarah —; m. 2d, Ann T. West (b. 1733); issue (of record):

1-James (b. Carlisle, Dec. 2, 1769-d. Harrisburg, Pa., Oct. 25, 1833), mcht., J.P., clk. orphan ct.; m. July 21, 1796, Martha, dau. of John Hamilton, m. Margaret Alexander; left issue (among others), Hamilton Alricks, M.C., 1837 (A317).

ALRICKS, **Jacob**, a trader on the Delaware, under the Dutch; commd. by them vice-director, 1657, dying soon after; married, but (according to Davis' History of Bucks co., Pa.), left no known issue; Hermanus Alricks (1804-1874), of Harrisburg, Pa., claimed descent from Jacob (P500e-P500f).

ALRICKS, **Peter** (b. Groningen, Holland, abt. 1631-d. prob. New Castle, Del., 1697), came from Holland to New Netherlands, with his uncle, Jacob Alricks (qv); commandant of fort nr. Henlopen, 1659; in 1661, with D'Hinoyossa, was sent by Beeckman, commandant at Fort Amstel (now New Castle, Del.), to negotiate with the gov. of Md. for a treaty of peace with the Indians; first bailiff and magistrate of New Castle and settlements; granted Alricks' island nr. Bristol, Pa., by Gov. Nicholls, 1667; commandant of the colonies on the Delaware, under the English, 1673; one of the first justices commd. by William Penn, 1682; mem. 1st Pa. assembly, 1683; repeatedly mem. of provincial council; married, had large family (M639-N151c).

ALSBACK, **Matthew**, came from Rotterdam to Phila. in the ship "Robert and Alice" of Dublin, and took oath of allegiance to Pa., Sept. 11, 1738; on same list appears the name of "Reynhart Alsbach" (P498).

ALSOB (Alsop?), **Thomas** (kld. by Indians, with others at Casco, Me., 1690), is recorded as of Salem Village, by Savage (G164).

ALSON, **Thomas**, brought from Eng. to Va., by Francis Osborne (V251).

ALSOFF, see also **Alsopp**.

ALSOFF, **George** (b. Eng. abt. 1630), a London apprentice, came from Eng. to Md. as indentured servant to Mr. Thomas Stockett, in 1650; published in 1666, in London, a delightful description of the province, entitled "A Character of Maryland" (M645-M646).

ALSOFF (Alsop), **George** (d. Milford, Conn., abt. 1680), was at Milford, 1667, but prob. did not constantly reside there; perhaps a bro. of Elizabeth Alsop (m. Milford, 1648, to Richard Baldwin), as her son, Sylvanus, b. some yrs. later, calls George his "near kinsman" (G164).

ALSOFF (Alsop), **Joseph** (b. Eng., 1621-d. New Haven, Conn., Nov. 8, 1698), prob. son of John Alsop of Stratford-on-Avon, Eng., and bro. of Thomas Alsop (qv); came from London to Boston, in the "Elizabeth and Ann", 1635, and settled early at New Haven; there took oath of fidelity, 1644; m. at New Haven, before 1647, Elizabeth, eldest dau. of William Preston; issue 1-Joseph (1648-d. Jan. 12, 1691), m. Nov. 25, 1672, Abigail, dau. of John Thompson the first, New Haven; no issue; left estate to widow and bros. John and Daniel; 2-Elizabeth (b. June 22, 1650); 3-Sarah (b. Sept. 8, 1652-d. prob. unm., Jan. 24, 1699); 4-Mary (b. Oct. 3, 1654), m. as his 2d wife, John Miles; 5-Abigail (b. Sept. 4, 1656), m. July 14, 1680, John Rowe; 6-Hannah (b. Dec. 2, 1659), was administrator of estate of her bro. Daniel, and managed the estate of her father with ability; whom she married does not appear; 7-John (b. Jan. 3, 1662); 8-Lydia (b. July 26, 1665); m. Nov. 8, 1688, James Trowbridge; 9-Daniel (b. Aug. 13, 1667-d. prob. unm., Jan. 11, 1689); 10-Jemina (b. Feb. 10, 1670). One dau. m. Thomas Talmadge; one, perhaps the same, m. John Paine (says Savage); (G164).

ALSOFF (Alsop), **Key**, merchant, Boston, Mass., 1668, m. Mary — (she m. as her 2d husband, Capt. William Turner, whose victory over the Indians in the Falls fight, 1676, gave his name to the spot); (G164).

ALSOFF (Alsop), **Richard** (b. Eng. 1660-d. Newtown, L.I., Oct. 1718), nephew and sole heir of Thomas Wardell of Newtown, came

from Eng. in his youth; m. at Newtown, 1686, Hannah — (1667-Aug. 23, 1757), issue: 1-Thomas (b. Sept. 7, 1687); 2-Richard (1726-1776), deputy from Middletown to gen. assembly of Conn., 1764, had issue; 3-John; 4-Hannah; 5-Deborah; 6-Amy; 7-Elizabeth (G164-N206b).

ALSOP (Alsop), Thomas (prob. b. Stratford-on-Avon, Eng., 1615-d.s.p., Stratford, Conn., abt. 1651), perhaps came from London to Boston, Mass., with bro. Joseph Alsop (qv), in ship "Elizabeth and Ann," 1635, and later settled in Stratford, Conn. (G164).

ALSOP, Timothy, mariner, New Haven, Conn., 1646 (G164).

ALSOPP, Henry, brought from Eng. to Va., 1648, by John Tiny, James City co. (V251).

ALSOPP, Jo. (b. 1585), embarked at port of London, Eng., May 15, 1635, to sail for Va. in the "Plaine Joan" (H1249).

ALSOPP, Robert (b. 1617), embarked at port of London, Eng., Sept. 1635, to be transported to Va. in the "David" (H1249).

ALSTADT, see also Allstadt.

ALSTADT, Martha, came from Rotterdam to Phila. in the ship "Mortonhouse," and took oath of allegiance to Pa., Aug. 19, 1729; Anna Judith Alstadt also is on the sailing list (P498).

ALSTON, see also Allston.

ALSTON (Allston), John (bap. Felmersham, Bedfordshire, Eng., Dec. 5, 1673-d. Chowan co., N.C., 1758), s. of John Alston of Parvenham, Eng., and descended from a landed family of Suffolk and Bedford; he came from Eng. to Carolina colony, prob. in 1710; settled on Bennett's creek, where Gatesville, N.C., now stands, in 1711; land-grants to sons in 1713; juror, 1715, grand-juror, 1721-24; justice of the peace and associate justice, 1724-29; held military rank of capt., major and col. after 1725; was sheriff of Chowan co., several terms; vestryman St. Paul's parish; m. abt. 1700, Mary (b. abt. 1687-d. after 1758), dau. of John Clark, m. Mary Palin, of Pasquotank, N.C.; issue: 1-Joseph John (b. 1702-d. Halifax co., N.C., 1781), owned 150 slaves and over 100,000 acres of land at death; m. Elizabeth, dau. of William Chancy, Sr., m. Deborah Simons; 4 children; m. 2d, Euphan, dau. of Willis Wilson, of Norfolk co. Va., m. Mary —; 5 children; 2-Solomon (d. 1784), m. abt. 1729, Ann (Nancy) Hinton, 11 children; 3-William (d. 1743), m. abt. 1735, Ann Kimbrough, 2 daus. (Ann m. 2d, 1748/49, Jeconias Yancey, and by him had 5 more daus. named Yancey); 4-Philip (d. Warren co., N.C., Nov. 20, 1783), m. 1746, Winifred (d. 1795), dau. of Thomas Whitmel of Bertie co., N.C.; 10 children; 5-James (d. Orange co., N.C., 1761), m. after 1741, Christian, dau. of George Lillington of Craven co., N.C., m. Hannah —; 5 children; 6-Mary, m. Henry Guston, no issue; m. 2d, William Seward, no issue; 7-Elizabeth, m. Samuel Williams (whose will, probated Edgecomb co., N.C., Feb. 1754, names 4 sons); 8-Sarah, m. Thomas Kearney (d. Aug. 1764), 2 sons, Edmund and Philip; 9-Martha (prob. d.s.p.), m. Chowan co., N.C., Jan. 29, 1752, to —; 10-Charity (d. Northampton, Mar. 1764), m. abt. 1755 (as his 2d wife), John Dawson (d. 1761 or 1762), 2 daus., 1 son (A306-N283).

ALSWORTH, William, brought from Eng. to Va., 1652, by Mr. John Browne, Northampton co., (V251).

ALSUP, see Alsop.

ALT, see also Allt.

ALT, Johannes (b.1698), came from Rotterdam to Phila. in the ship "Queen Elizabeth," and took oath of allegiance to Pa., Sept. 16, 1738; on ship's list as "age 40" (P498).

ALTECK, Daniel, came from Rotterdam to Phila. in the "Christian," and took oath of allegiance to Pa., Sept. 13, 1749 (P498).

ALTENBERGER, Johan, came from Rotterdam to Phila., in the ship "St. Andrew" (by

ship's galley, up the Delaware from Cape Henlopen), and took oath of allegiance to Pa., Sept. 24, 1737 (P498).

ALTER, Jacob (b. Switzerland-d. Alter's Mills, Cumberland co., Pa., 1806), shoemaker; came to Pa., abt. 1765, and located at Lititz, Lancaster co., where he made shoes for the patriot army during the Am. Rev.; in 1790, removed to Cumberland co., which he represented in the state legislature, six or seven terms; m. abt. 1768, Veronica Landis of Lancaster co., issue: 1-Veronica (b. Oct. 9, 1769), m. Lawrence Lefevre (he m. 2d, Sarah Line), 8 children; 2-John (b. Sept. 13, 1771), m. Eleanor Sheets, 8 children; 3-Jacob (b. Jan. 1, 1773-d. West Pennsboro, Pa., June 29, 1839), rep. Cumberland co., in Pa. legislature, 21 consecutive terms from 1814; m. Elizabeth Foutz (b. nr. Hagerstown, Md., Apr. 19, 1768-d. Cumberland co., Pa., June 7, 1855), 9 children; 4-David (b. Feb. 7, 1775), m. Miss Mell, 2 or more children; 5-Esther (b. Feb. 28, 1777), m. Michael Bear (d. Plainfield, Pa.), a Mennonite preacher, 2 or more children; 6-Susannah (b. Oct. 30, 1780-d. Mt. Rock, abt. 1840), m. 1800, Joseph Ritner (b. Berks co., Pa., Mar. 25, 1780-d. nr. Mt.
