

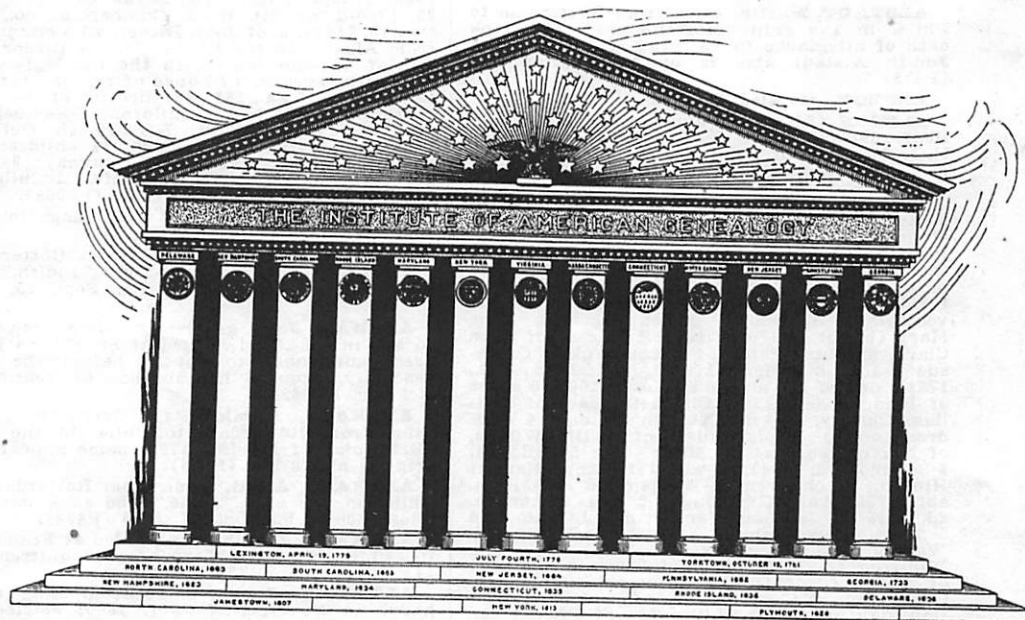

The Thirteen Columns, raised upon the solid foundation laid by the principal events in American Colonial History enumerated on the rising stairs, represent the Original Thirteen Colonies, the principal source of American Genealogy.

The name on the frieze symbolizes the Institute bringing together under one head the genealogy of the Original Thirteen Colonies, and the diffusing rays in the pediment symbolize the dissemination of the genealogies throughout the country.

**ALSOP (Alsop), Thomas** (prob. b. Stratford-  
on-Avon, Eng., 1615-d.s.p., Stratford, Conn.,  
abt. 1651), perhaps came from London to Bos-  
ton, Mass., with bro. Joseph Alsop (qv), in  
ship "Elizabeth and Ann," 1635, and later  
settled in Stratford, Conn. (G164).

**ALSOP, Timothy**, mariner, New Haven,  
Conn., 1646 (G164).

**ALSOPP, Henry**, brought from Eng. to Va.,  
1648, by John Tiny, James City co. (V251).

**ALSOPP, Jo.** (b. 1585), embarked at port of  
London, Eng., May 15, 1635, to sail for Va. in  
the "Plaine Joan" (H1249).

**ALSOPP, Robert** (b. 1617), embarked at port  
of London, Eng., Sept. 1635, to be transported  
to Va. in the "David" (H1249).

**ALSTADT, see also Allstadt.**

**ALSTADT, Martin**, came from Rotterdam to  
Phila. in the ship "Mortonhouse," and took  
oath of allegiance to Pa., Aug. 19, 1729; Anna  
Judith Alstadt also is on the sailing list  
(P498).

**ALSTON, see also Allston.**

**ALSTON (Allston), John** (bap. Felmersham,  
Bedfordshire, Eng., Dec. 5, 1673-d. Chowan co.,  
N.C., 1758), s. of John Alston of Farvenham,  
Eng., and descended from a landed family of  
Suffolk and Bedford; he came from Eng. to  
Carolina colony, prob. in 1710; settled on Ben-  
nett's creek, where Gatesville, N.C., now  
stands, in 1711; land-grants to sons in 1713;  
juror, 1715, grand-juror, 1721-24; justice of  
the peace and associate justice, 1724-29; held  
military rank of capt., major and col. after  
1725; was sheriff of Chowan co., several terms;  
vestryman St. Paul's parish; m. abt. 1700,  
Mary (b. abt. 1687-d. after 1758), dau. of John  
Clark, m. Mary Palin, of Pasquotank, N.C.; is-  
sue: 1-Joseph John (b. 1702-d. Halifax co., N.C.,  
1781), owned 150 slaves and over 100,000 acres  
of land at death; m. Elizabeth, dau. of Wil-  
liam Chancy, Sr., m. Deborah Simons; 4 chil-  
dren; m. 2d, Euphan, dau. of Willis Wilson,  
of Norfolk co. Va., m. Mary —; 5 children;  
2-Solomon (d. 1784), m. abt. 1729, Ann (Nancy)  
Hinton, 11 children; 3-William (d. 1743), m.  
abt. 1735, Ann Kimbrough, 2 daus. (Ann m.  
2d, 1748/49, Jeconia Yancey, and by him had  
5 more daus. named Yancey); 4-Phillip (d.  
Warren co., N.C., Nov. 20, 1783), m. 1746,  
Winifred (d. 1795), dau. of Thomas Whitmel  
of Bertie co., N.C.; 10 children; 5-James (d.  
Orange co., N.C., 1761), m. after 1741, Chris-  
tian, dau. of George Lillington of Craven co.,  
N.C., m. Hannah —; 5 children; 6-Mary, m.  
Henry Guston, no issue; m. 2d, William  
Seward, no issue; 7-Elizabeth, m. Samuel Wil-  
liams (whose will, probated Edgcomb co.,  
N.C., Feb. 1754, names 4 sons); 8-Sarah, m.  
Thomas Kearney (d. Aug. 1764), 2 sons, Ed-  
mond and Phillip; 9-Martha (prob. d.s.p.), m.  
Chowan co., N.C., Jan. 29, 1752, to —; 10-  
Charity (d. Northampton, Mar. 1764), m. abt.  
1755 (as his 2d wife), John Dawson (d. 1761  
or 1762), 2 daus., 1 son (A306-N283).

**ALSWORTH, William**, brought from Eng.  
to Va., 1652, by Mr. John Browne, Northamp-  
ton co., (V251).

**ALT, Johannes** (b.1698), came from Rotter-  
dam to Phila. in the ship "Queen Elizabeth,"  
and took oath of allegiance to Pa., Sept. 16,  
1738; on ship's list as "age 40" (P498).

**ALTECK, Daniel**, came from Rotterdam to  
Phila. in the "Christian," and took oath of  
allegiance to Pa., Sept. 13, 1749 (P498).

**ALTENBERGER, Johan**, came from Rotter-  
dam to Phila., in the ship "St. Andrew" (by

ship's galley, up the Delaware from Cape  
Henlopen), and took oath of allegiance to Pa.,  
Sept. 24, 1737 (P498).

**ALTER, Jacob** (b. Switzerland-d. Alter's  
Mills, Cumberland co., Pa., 1806), shoemaker;  
came to Pa., abt. 1765, and located at Lititz,  
Lancaster co., where he made shoes for the  
patriot army during the Am. Rev.; in 1790, re-  
moved to Cumberland co., which he represented  
in the state legislature, six or seven terms;  
m. abt. 1768, Veronica Landis of Lancaster  
co., issue: 1-Veronica (b. Oct. 9, 1769), m.  
Lawrence Lefevre (he m. 2d, Sarah Line), 8  
children; 2-John (b. Sept. 13, 1771), m. Eleanor  
Sheets, 8 children; 3-Jacob (b. Jan. 1, 1773-  
d. West Pennsboro, Pa., June 29, 1839), rep.  
Cumberland co., in Pa. legislature, 21 consecu-  
tive terms from 1814; m. Elizabeth Foutz (b.  
nr. Hagerstown, Md., Apr. 19, 1768-d. Cumber-  
land co., Pa., June 7, 1855), 9 children; 4-  
David (b. Feb. 7, 1775), m. Miss Mell, 2 or  
more children; 5-Esther (b. Feb. 28, 1777), m.  
Michael Bear (d. Plainfield, Pa.), a Mennonite  
preacher, 2 or more children; 6-Susannah  
(b. Oct. 30, 1780-d. Mt. Rock, abt. 1840), m.  
1800, Joseph Ritner (b. Berks co., Pa., Mar.  
25, 1780-d. nr. Mt. Rock, Cumberland co., Pa.,  
Oct. 16, 1869), s. of John Ritner, who emigrated  
from Alsace, on the Rhine; Joseph Ritner was  
rep. of Washington co. in the Pa. legislature  
for 6 yrs., speaker of house of representatives,  
2 yrs., gov. of Pa., 1835-38; director of the mint  
at Phila., 1848; had 8 children; 6-Samuel (b.  
Mar. 17, 1779-d. s. p.); 7-Henry (b. Oct. 25,  
1774), m. Maria E. Rinehard, 11 children; 8-  
Abraham (b. Mar. 13, 1787-d. unm.); 9-Mar-  
garet (b. Mar. 23, 1790), m. Mr. McCullough  
of Washington co., Pa., no issue (P500a).

**ALTER, John**, brought from Eng. to Va.,  
1642, by John Bayles (V251).

**ALTHAM, Heinrich**, came from Rotterdam,  
via Cowes, to Phila., in the ship "Judith," and  
took oath of allegiance to Pa., Sept. 15, 1748  
(P498).

**ALTHAM, John**, gentleman, came from Eng.  
to Md. in 1637, and settled at St. Mary's Hun-  
dred; summoned to appear before the gen.  
assembly, excused his absence by reason of  
sickness (M632).

**ALTHAUS, Abraham** (b. Germany, 1707),  
came from Rotterdam to Phila. in the ship  
"Brittania" of London, 1731; name appears on  
original ship's list (P498).

**ALTHAUS, Arndt**, came from Rotterdam to  
Phila. in the ship "Fane," and took oath of  
allegiance to Pa., Oct. 17, 1749 (P498).

**ALTHAUS, Joseph**, was settled at Franconia  
tp., Phila. co., Pa., where he paid quitrent on  
141 acres before 1734 (P492).

**ALTHEAM, Simon**, came from Eng. (per-  
haps) to Dover, N.H., abt. 1660; settled on  
Martha's Vineyard, 1690; rep. gen. court, 1692;  
m. Mary, dau. of Simon Butler; issue: 1-Jethro  
(bap. 1700), m. 1724, Mary, dau. of Rev. Ex-  
perience Mayhew, m. Thankful Hinckley  
(N140a).

**ALTHER, Peter** (b.1714), came from Rotter-  
dam to Phila. in the ship "Lydia," and took  
oath of allegiance to Pa., Sept. 20, 1743; on  
ship's list as "Peter Alden, age 29" (P498).

**ALTHER, John**, Georgia, 1748; in partner-  
ship with Gaspar Holsteter (Aughester?), on  
Apr. 21, 1748, was granted a small island, com-  
prising 234 acres in Augustin creek, by court  
of pres. and assts. of Ga. (G192a).

**ALTHONIUS (Aldamos), Johan Fried** (b.  
1716), came from Rotterdam to Phila. in the  
ship "Lydia," and took oath of allegiance to  
Pa., Sept. 27, 1740; also called "Fredrich Al-  
damos, age 24"; he was a fellow-passenger  
of Peter Altonius (qv); (P498).

**ALTONIUS (Aldamos), Peter** (b. 1700), came  
from Rotterdam to Phila., in the ship "Lydia,"  
and took oath of allegiance to Pa., Sept. 27,  
1740; also called "Peter Aldamos, age 40"; he  
was a fellow-passenger of Johan Fried Al-  
thoniuss (qv); (P498).
