## 18 Post Offices In Fairfield in The Year of 1854

Fairfield county has today eight post offices, compared to 18 that were operative in the District in the year 1854. The News and Herald was apprised of this via a clipping sent by Herbert Hucks, Jr., archivist, Wofford College Library.

Mr. Hucks copied the list of South Carolina post offices from the Daily Carolina Times, issue of Friday morning, Dec. 8, 1854, a newspaper published in Columbia. Included in the list were these post offices in the "Fairfield District":

Alston, Bell's Store, Brown's, Buckhead, Cookham, Feasterville, Gladden's Grove, Jackson's Creek, Longtown, Monticello C. H., Poplar Springs, Ridgeway, Ridgewood, Rocky Mount, Thompsons, White Oak, Winnsborough and Yonguesville.

Postmaster S. R. Elliott informs that the following eight post offices are currently operating in the county: Blackstock, Blair, Jenkinsville, Ridgeway, Rion, Shelton, White Oak, and Winnsboro.

Fairfield District of 1854 and Fairfield county of 1972 did not encompass identical areas. Also, perhaps, some reader could inform what the initials "C.H.," after the name "Monticello," signified?
