

*Miles Brewton House, 27 King Street, circa 1767. One of the most important houses in Charleston it has been called the supreme example of the double house in the city. Because of its spaciousness and sumptuous interior, the house during the British occupation became the headquarters of Sir Henry Clinton, Lord Rawdon and the Marquess Cornwallis. In 1865 it was occupied by Generals George Gordon Meade and John P. Hatch. It has been the home of some of Charleston's most distinguished families—Brewton, Motte, Alston, Pringle, Frost and Manigault—and has never passed out of the hands of the descendants of Miles Brewton, its builder.
