Died at his residence in Abbeville District on Tuesday evening, the 8th inst., Mr. William Henderson, in the 60th year of his age. He has left a large family, as well as many friends and acquaintances to mourn his everlasting departure. (Ibid.)

At his father's residence in Abbeville, on Tuesday evening, the 1st inst., Mr. Wesley Dodson, in the 23d year of his age. ( $\underline{\text{Ibid}}$ .)

Departed this life on the 18th inst., in Laurens District, Mrs. Mary Bailey, consort of David Bailey, deceased. According to the best registers, and what she frequently told, she must have been upwards of 100 years of age. She was a native of Maryland, and was married and had two children at the time of Braddock's defeat. She was the mother of eleven children, which all lived and raised families, except one; but as to the number of her descendants it cannot be easily ascertained. She lived a social and agreeable life with her husband 63 years. (Ibid.)
