John Alston was a graduate of Glas^(c)gow University - Came to America before Revolution & settled on Cedar Creek in lower part of Fairfield Co., S.C.

He md. Mary Boyd, a young Scotch girl who was rescued from ship-wreck & brought to America on the vessel on which John Alston was a passenger.

John Alston was commissioned by King George III, as a Surveyor.

Alston, Fairfield Co, SC was named in honor of Alston family. The handsome Alston brick house which withstood the forays by the Tories of the Revolution was burned by Sherman's men in 1865.
