

COLONEL A. O. ANDREWS.—Colonel A. O. Andrews, formerly editor of the Charleston (S. C.) *Courier*, died in that city yesterday, in the sixty-third year of his age. Deceased was for many years president of the Charleston Chamber of Commerce, and was prominent in connection with the coast survey and other useful public enterprises. Colonel Andrews took an active interest in militia matters, and, as may be remembered, delivered the oration at Faneuil Hall, Boston, a few months ago, when the Washington Light Infantry were received by the Boston "Tigers." He will also be remembered in connection with the terrible calamity which befell the steamship *Champion*, while on her voyage from this city to Charleston in November last; when his wife, Mrs. A. O. Andrews, together with her daughter, Miss Mary Mikell, an interesting young lady of seventeen, were both lost, while hastening home to Charleston from Europe.—*New York Herald.*
