Compiled Service Records of Soldiers Who Served in the American Army During the Revolutionary War showing Second Regiment, South Carolina. There is a card showing private, card number 37436710 and then 194120, Book Mark RP 436786. Then there is another card showing "Copied From Rolls" date of enlistment Aug 1, 1779, with a faint writing of Nov 1, 1779 under that. It shows Vol 9, page 3. ----- I don't know what this means. Did he only serve from Aug. 1, 1779 until Nov 1, 1779? Did he return after the war? Did he die in the war?

A listing of Pay Rolls of the Second Regiment of the 1st November 1779 which shows an alphabetical listing of soldiers. It lists Enoch Andrews as Private.

He is listed as a descendant in his father's will. - YES - WILL

Yes, in Deed Book S, page 139, he sold his 100 acre land grant to Robert Rabb 19 Aug 1787 but, not recorded into Mar 1809. You can [click here](#) to go to Deed Book S, and select page 139 (begins here).

Did he die in the war or return to the area or move on to other areas?

He dad's will is dated 28 Oct 1797 and he was alive then, apparently, he returned home sold land and moved away.
