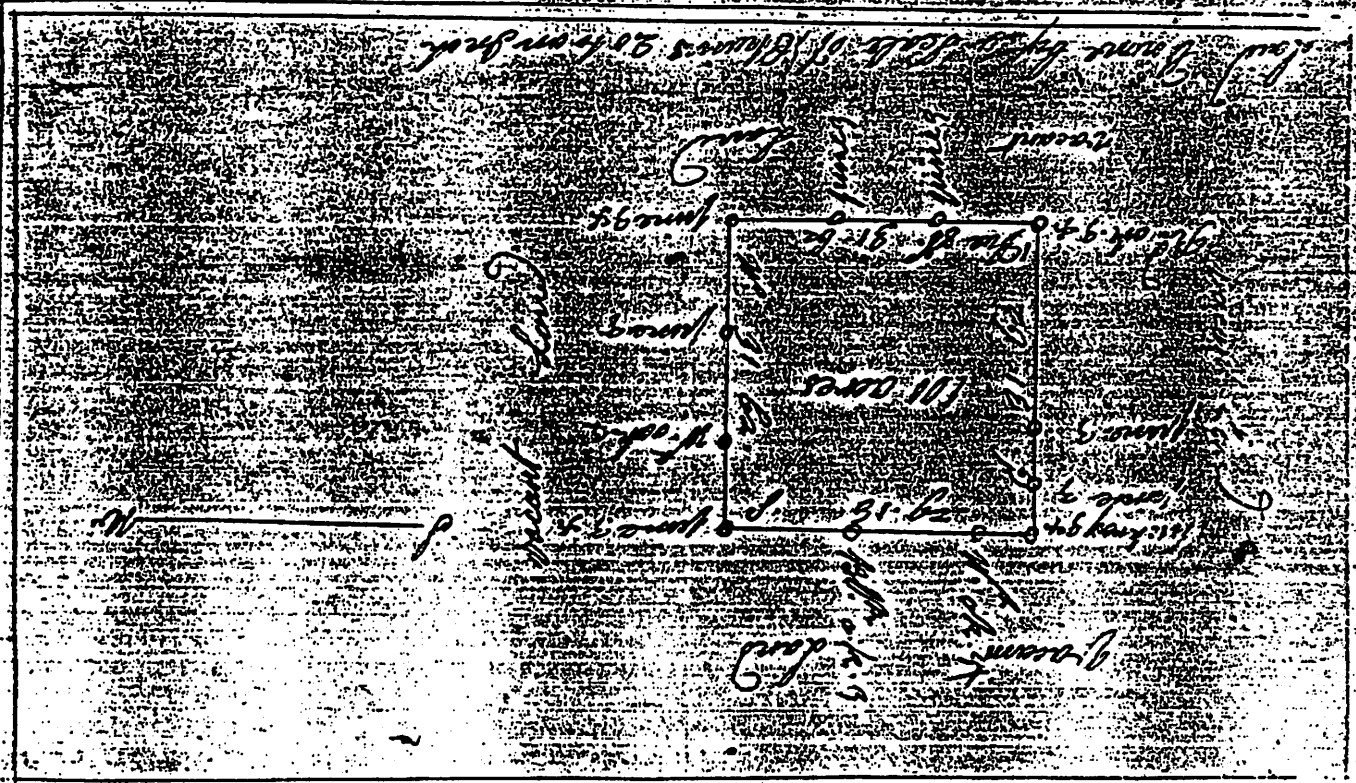
Wagoners (Carried for the 21<sup>st</sup> day of July 1871)

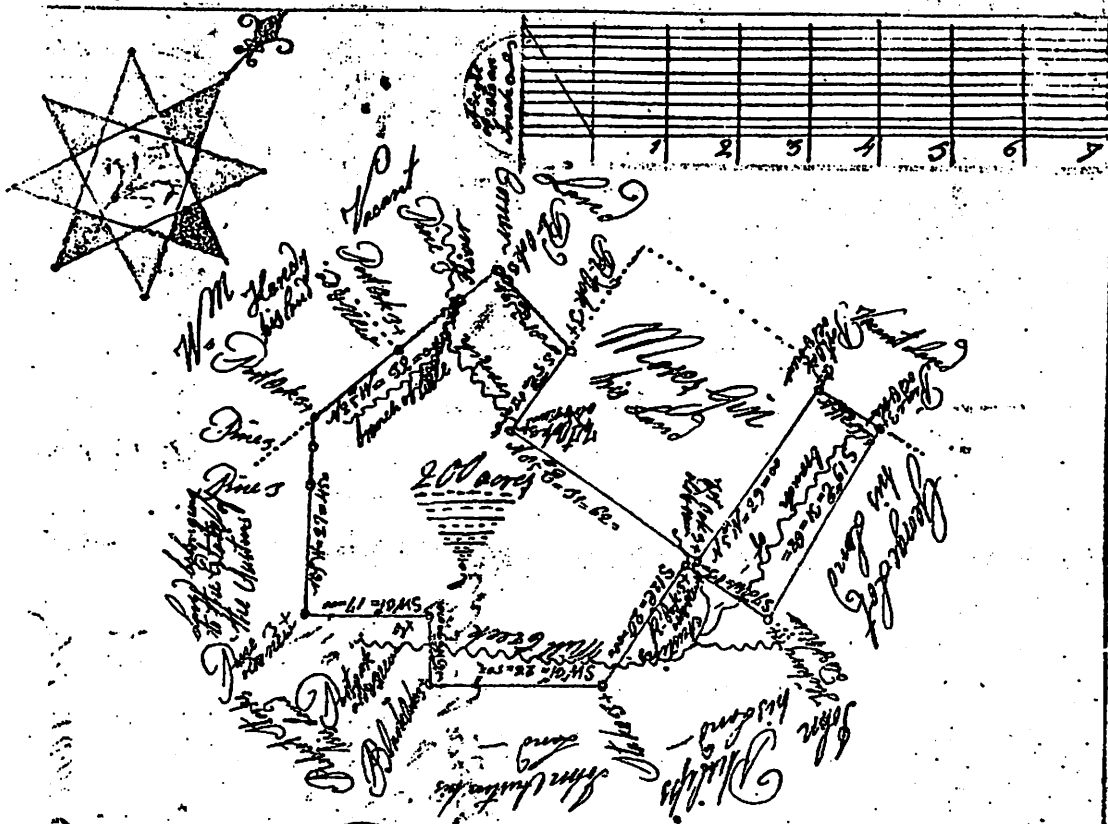
Wagon and pack trail days and weeks as the above table
