Survivors are three brothers, Van Brown of Chester, and Judge Brown and Lewis Brown, both of Baltimore, Md.

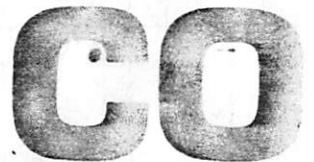
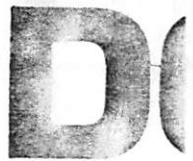
## Mr. Walker Robbins
